ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD REPEALING AND RECREATING AND AMENDING RULES

The Wisconsin Natural Resources Board adopts an order to repeal and recreate ch. NR 20 and amend NR 21.02(16) relating to sport fishing regulations

FH - 56 - 98

Analysis Prepared by Department of Natural Resources

Statutory authority: ss. 29.014(1) and 227.11(2), Stats.

Statutes interpreted: ss. 29.014(1) and 29.041, Stats.

Section 1 repeals and recreates chapter NR 20, and makes the following minor changes and corrections:

Creates a definition for "Lake Michigan tributaries"; clarifies a definition for the "Lower Wisconsin River" in order to consolidate currently conflicting descriptions; creates a definition for 'Mid Lake Reef complex"; creates a definition for "Major Green Bay tributaries; creates a definition for "panfish" to include bluegill, black crappie, white crappie, yellow perch, pumpkinseed and adds green sunfish, orangespotted sunfish and warmouth; creates a definition for "trout streams"; makes minor corrections to the lake trout season on Lake Michigan tributaries to match the Lake Michigan regulations; removes bays of the St.Louis River, Douglas County from the inland regulations and places them under Wisconsin-Minnesota boundary waters; clarifies the daily bag limit for panfish on outlying waters and their tributaries (most inland and outlying waters will have a daily bag limit of 25 in total); clarifies the opening date for trout and salmon on certain tributaries to Lake Superior to make it more consistent from year to year; clarifies the prohibition on hook and line lake sturgeon fishing for Lake Winnebago System waters; clarifies the closure of the rough fish spearing season on Lake Winnebago system waters; clarifies the intent of the gear restrictions for the early catch and release trout season to require artificial lures with barbless hooks while fishing on all trout streams during this period, regardless of the species sought; modifies the hours of the early catch and release season for trout so the season ends at 6 p.m. on the Friday preceding the general open season, rather than 4:59 a.m. on the day of the general open season; corrects an omission on gear restrictions for upper Neenah Creek to require artificial lures only; includes all waters of Jefferson County under the category 3 trout regulations; clarifies the description of the portions of the Pecatonica River, Iowa County, having a continuous open season for hook and line fishing; clarifies the waters of Castle Rock flowage that are open to trolling; corrects the name of the railroad line running along the Wisconsin side of the Mississippi and St. Croix Rivers to reflect a recent name change from the Burlington Northern Railroad to Burlington Northern and Santa Fe Railroad; includes outlying waters in the requirement to mark live boxes with the name and address of the owner; eliminates the requirement to sign trout stamps to accommodate the new automated licensing system; removes channel catfish from the list of detrimental species

on Lake Winnebago System waters; and adds bullheads to the list of detrimental fish species in Yellowstone Lake, Lafayette County.

Section 2 modifies the definition of Wisconsin-Minnesota boundary waters to include bays of the St. Louis River estuary and corrects the name of the railroad line running along the Wisconsin side of the Mississippi and St. Croix Rivers to reflect a recent name change from the Burlington Northern Railroad to Burlington Northern and Santa Fe Railroad.

Subchapter I Purpose and Definitions

NR 20.01 Purpose. This chapter establishes open and closed seasons, bag limits, possession limits, size restrictions and other rules governing the taking of fish in the inland and outlying waters of Wisconsin.

NR 20.03 Definitions. In this chapter:

- (1) "Angler" means any person engaged in fishing.
- (2) "Artificial fly" means a single hook dressed with fur, feathers, hair, silk, tinsel, thread or similar material to imitate the natural food of fish.
- (3) "Artificial lure" means a spoon, spinner, jig, plug or other fish bait made of hair, feathers, cork, wood, rubber, metal, plastic or other synthetic materials, or

combinations of these materials. An "artificial lure" may not include natural or organic food stuffs such as corn, marshmallows, dough, cheese, meat, living or dead organisms or parts of those items, except hair, feathers, cork, wood or rubber.

- (4) "Attached", for the purpose of s. NR 20.10, means affixed to the sturgeon immediately in front of the tail.
- (5) "Barbless hooks" means hooks with no barbs, or hooks with barbs that have been compressed to be in complete contact with the shank of the hook.
 - (6) "Business day" has the meaning given it in s. 421.301 (6), Stats.
- (7) "Current validated sturgeon carcass tag", for the purpose of s. NR 20.10, means an unused tag of the current year validated according to the requirements of s. NR 20.10 (5).
- (8) "Daily bag limit" means the maximum number of fish that may be reduced to a person's possession in one day.
 - (9) "Department" means the department of natural resources.
- (10) "Dip net" means a piece of netting suspended from a round or square frame that does not exceed 8 feet in diameter or 8 feet square.
- (11) "Fish length" means the distance from the tip of the snout in a straight line to the utmost end of the tail fin fully compressed.
- (12) "Fishing" or "fish", when used as a verb, means to take, capture, kill or attempt to take, capture or kill any variety of fish in the waters of the state.
- (13) "Fishing shelter" means any building, tent, vehicle, shanty or similar enclosure used for the purpose of fishing.
 - (14) "Game fish" has the meaning found in s. 29.001(41).
- (15) "Green Bay" means those waters of Lake Michigan located to the west of the Green Bay-Lake Michigan line. For the purposes of s. NR 20.20, Green Bay shall mean Green Bay, Sturgeon Bay, Sawyer's Harbor, the Sturgeon Bay ship canal from Sturgeon Bay to a line located in the NE¼ of the NW¼, section 22, T27N, R26E, Door county, commencing at a point on the southwest shore of the Sturgeon Bay ship canal directly beneath the center of the Wisconsin public service company power line and extending in a northeasterly direction beneath and parallel to the center of the power line to a point on the northeast shore of the ship canal and the Fox river from its mouth up to the dam at DePere.
- (16) "Green Bay-Lake Michigan line" means a line commencing at the northwest side of the Northport dock where it joins the shoreline in section 33, T33N, R29E; then running northeasterly to the range light (signal light) on Plum island; then running along the north and west shore of Plum island to the U.S. coast guard station; then running northerly to the southwesterly point on Shellswick dock, which is located on Lobdell's point on Washington island; then running along Shellswick dock to the shoreline of Lobdell's point; then running along the west shore of Washington island to Boyer's Bluff light; then running north to its terminus at the Wisconsin-Michigan boundary line.
- (17) "Lake Michigan" means those waters of Lake Michigan located east of the Green Bay-Lake Michigan line.
- (18) "Lake Michigan tributaries" means the Pike river and its tributaries, Kenosha and Racine counties; Kewaunee river and its tributaries excluding Little Scarboro, Scarboro, Roger and Casco creeks, Kewaunee county; Milwaukee river upstream to the Chair Factory dam in the village of Grafton, Milwaukee and Ozaukee counties;

Menomonee river upstream to the 45th street drop structure in the city of Milwaukee, Milwaukee county; and all other tributaries to Lake Michigan upstream to the first dam or lake.

- (19) "Lake Winnebago system" means Buttes des Morts lake, Winneconne lake, Poygan lake, Winnebago lake and all their tributaries from their mouths upstream to the first dam including the Fox river from Lake Winnebago upstream to the dam above Princeton and all its tributaries from their mouths upstream to the first dam and the Wolf river from its mouth upstream to the dam in the city of Shawano and all its tributaries from their mouths upstream to the first dam including Cincoe lake, Partridge Crop lake and Partridge lake in Calumet, Fond du Lac, Green Lake, Marquette, Outagamie, Shawano, Waupaca, Waushara and Winnebago counties.
- (20) "Lower Wisconsin river" means the Wisconsin river including all sloughs, bayous, flowages and tributaries from their mouths upstream to the first highway bridge in Columbia, Sauk, Dane, Iowa, Richland, Grant and Crawford counties upstream from the Burlington Northern and Santa Fe railroad tracks in Grant and Crawford counties...
- (21) "Major Green bay tributaries" means Duck creek upstream to the first dam above the Pamperin park foot bridge in the village of Howard excluding its tributaries, Suamico river upstream to CTH HS, East river upstream to Hoffman road (CTH XX) excluding its tributaries, Brown county; Peshtigo river upstream to the Peshtigo dam, Little river upstream to Radar road, Marinette county; Little Suamico river upstream to CTH J excluding tributaries, Pensaukee river upstream to CTH J exluding tributaries, Oconto river upstream to Stiles dam excluding tributaries except Little river, Little river upstream to state highway 141 excluding tributaries, Oconto county.
- (22) "Mendota lake" means Mendota lake, Cherokee lake, Warner Park lagoons, Pheasant Branch creek from its mouth upstream to county highway M, Sixmile creek from its mouth upstream to state highway 19 in sec. 8, and Yahara river from its mouth upstream to state highway 19, Dane county.
- (23) "Mid lake reef complex" means those waters of Lake Michigan within the following area: All waters bounded by a line beginning at a point where 43 degrees 7 minutes north latitude and 87 degrees 40 minutes west longitude intersect, northerly to 43 degrees 20 minutes north latitude, easterly to 87 degrees 20 minutes west longitude, northerly to 43 degrees 30 minutes north latitude, easterly to the Wisconsin-Michigan state line, southerly to 43 degree north latitude, westerly to 87 degrees 14 minutes west longitude, northerly to 43 degrees 3 minutes north latitude, westerly to 87 degrees 18 minutes, southerly to 43 degrees north latitude, westerly to 87 degrees 23 minutes west longitude, northwesterly to 43 degrees 7 minutes north latitude, and westerly to 87 degrees 40 minutes west latitude. This area encompasses the elevated areas of the lake bed commonly known as the Sheboygan reef, the Northeast reef, the Milwaukee reef, and the East reef.
 - (24) "Minnow dip net" has the same meaning as "dip net".
- (25) "Minnow seine" means a seine that does not exceed 35 feet in length with mesh that does not exceed one-half inch stretch measure.
- (26) "Minnow trap" means a device for catching minnows that does not exceed 24 inches in length and does not exceed 16 inches in width with an opening in the throat of the trap that does not exceed 1½ inches in diameter.

- (27) "Muskellunge" means fish of the species *Esox masquinongy* and includes muskellunge northern pike hybrids.
 - (28) "Openly exposed" means open to view by a person in a passing vehicle.
- (29) "Panfish" means the following fish species: yellow perch, bluegill, black crappie, white crappie, pumpkinseed, green sunfish, warmouth and orangespotted sunfish.
- (30) "Position fishing" means fishing from a boat in a manner where the fishing line extends vertically into the water while the boat is maneuvered by the use of a motor.
- (31) "Possession limit" means the maximum number of a fish species that a person may possess, which is twice the daily bag limit specified in this chapter except the possession limit for trout is 10 of which no more than 5 may be a combined total of brown and rainbow trout and the possession limit for minnows is specified in s. NR 20.14.
 - (32) "Rough fish" has the meaning found in s. 29.001(74)
- (33) "Safe harvest" means a level of harvest that incorporates an appropriate margin of safety, estimates of the population and acceptable exploitation rates which will reasonably prevent harvest of more than 35% of the population of adult walleyes or 27% of the population of adult muskellunge. The margin of safety assures that the true safe harvest is not exceeded in more than 1 of 40 cases. For waters where a population estimate has not been made, a regression model based upon population estimates from other waters will be used.
 - (34) "Secretary" means secretary of the department of natural resources.
 - (35) "Seine" has the meaning found in s. 29.522(3), Stats.
- (36) "Setline" means a line with one or more hooks fastened to it and designed to be set or left unattended in the water for the purpose of taking fish.
- (37) "Set or bank pole" means a pole equipped with a line with one or more hooks fastened to it, designed to be used for fishing from the banks of lakes or rivers and set or left unattended.
- (38) "Spearing" means fishing with a device consisting of a shaft with an attached sharp point or points and includes devices such as spears, bow and arrow, spear guns or similar devices.
- (39) "Telemetry device" means any device attached to or implanted in a fish that transmits a sonic or electronic signal.
- (40) "Troll" or "trolling" means fishing by trailing any lure, bait or similar device that may be used to attract or catch fish from a boat propelled by a means other than drifting or rowing. Casting and immediate retrieval of a bait, lure or similar device while the motor is running or position fishing is not trolling.
- (41) "Trout stream" means those waters designated by the department pursuant to s. NR 1.02(7).

(42) "Unattended line" means a fishing line to which no person is actively directing his or her attention.

Subchapter II Prohibited Methods

NR 20.05 General restrictions. No person may do any of the following:

- (1) Fish by any means other than hook and line except as specifically authorized in s. NR 20.20.
- (2) Possess or control any firearm, gun or similar device at any time while on the waters, banks or shores that might be used for the purpose of fishing.
- (3) Fish within 200 feet of any fishway, lock or dam by any means other than by hook and line in the inland waters.
 - (4) Fish at any time other than during the open season.
- (5) Fish for any variety of fish in trout streams other than during the open season for trout except that rough fish may be taken by hand at any time in all waters.
- (6) Fish for, possess or control fish in excess of the daily bag limit authorized in s. NR 20.20 for that water while on the waters, banks or shores of waters or while fishing.
- (7) Possess or control fish unless they are included as part of the daily bag limit. Fish that are not released immediately shall be included as part of the daily bag limit.
 - (8) Possess or control any fish in excess of the possession limit.
- (9) Possess or control fish of any size other than that authorized by the size restriction.
 - (10) Use, attach or implant a telemetry device on or into a fish.
- (11) Raise, remove or otherwise tamper with another person's commercial fishing gear set in any water without permission from the licensed user. This restriction does not apply to agents of the department.
- (12) Use, possess, control, set or place in any water any live box, or similar device that might be used for the keeping of fish unless a tag of permanent material bearing the name and address of the owner or user is securely attached and is readable and legible.

Note: This restriction does not apply to receptacles carried by the angler to contain fish while fishing.

(13) Sponsor a fishing tournament unless a permit has been obtained from the department pursuant to s. NR 20.40.

NR 20.06 Hook and line fishing. No person may do any of the following:

- (1) Fish in inland waters by the method of trolling except where specifically authorized in s. NR 20.20.
 - (2) Fish with more than 3 hooks, baits or lures.
- (3) Fish with any hook and line fishing tackle, bait, hooks or lures on waters where its use is not authorized in s. NR 20.20. Gear restrictions for trout and salmon on waters or portions of waters specified in s. NR 20.20 apply to all species while fishing on those waters.
 - (4) Use a landing net larger than 3 feet in diameter.
- (5) Use a gaff in any manner other than for landing a fish that is legally hooked unless specifically authorized in s. NR 20.20.
- (6) Fish by snagging, foul hooking or attempting to hook fish other than in the mouth.
- (7) Possess, retain or fail to immediately release fish hooked other than in the mouth.

- (8) Use, possess, control, set or place any snag line or snag pole, snaghook or cluster of hooks that could be placed into or drawn through the water for the purpose of catching fish or drawing the hooks into the body of fish.
- (9) Fish with an unattended line except where specifically authorized under s. NR 20.20. Failure to immediately respond to a line upon indication of a bite shall be prima facie evidence that the line is unattended.

Note: For further restrictions on the use of setlines and set or bank poles, see s. NR 20.12.

(10) Fish in open water with a free-floating or anchored buoyant device with attached hook and line that is not held or otherwise controlled by the angler.

Note: This method is commonly known as jug fishing.

NR 20.07 Special sturgeon hook and line fishing restrictions. No person may do any of the following:

(1) Possess a lake sturgeon taken by hook and line unless a hook and line lake sturgeon tag is immediately attached to the lake sturgeon and the tagged lake sturgeon is registered at a department lake sturgeon registration station by 6:00 p.m. on the day after it was taken.

Note: Hook and line lake sturgeon tags will be available at department service centers and regional offices each year prior to the open season.

- (2) Remove the registration tag attached to the fish by the department until the carcass is prepared for final consumption. The hook and line lake sturgeon registration tag shall be retained by the person taking the lake sturgeon until the fish is consumed.
- (3) Transport any lake sturgeon in or on any motor-driven vehicle from the time the lake sturgeon is taken to the time it is lawfully registered pursuant to sub. (1) unless the lake sturgeon is carried openly exposed and in a manner so that the lake sturgeon tag attached to the lake sturgeon cannot be handled or manipulated by any occupant of the vehicle.
- (4) Transport any lake sturgeon in or on any boat from the time the lake sturgeon is taken to the time it is lawfully registered pursuant to sub. (1) unless the lake sturgeon is carried openly exposed.
- (5) Obtain more than one hook and line lake sturgeon tag except that one additional hook and line lake sturgeon tag may be obtained for Wisconsin-Michigan boundary waters.

NR 20.08 Restrictions on the use of bait. No person may do any of the following:

- (1) Use goldfish as bait or possess goldfish in any form or manner on any water of the state.
- (2) Use alewife as bait or possess alewife in any form or manner on any water of the state except Lake Michigan and Green Bay.
- (3) Release any unused bait into any waters of the state unless issued a permit pursuant to s. 29.736, Stats.
- (4) Use as bait, possess or release any minnows or other fish on the waters or shores of waters that have been chemically treated for trout management when posted by department signs.
- (5) Take, gather, collect, possess or attempt to take, gather or collect larvae or nymphs of aquatic insects from any trout stream for use or sale as bait except that a

licensed angler may take larvae or nymphs from trout streams by hand during the open trout season for immediate use as bait only in the trout stream from which the larvae or nymphs were taken.

NR 20.09 Spearing restrictions. No person may do any of the following:

- (1) Possess or control any bow, spear or similar device while on any water or on the banks or shores of any water that might be used for the purpose of fishing except as specifically authorized in s. NR 20.20.
- (2) Use, possess or control any bow, spear or similar device from sunset to sunrise while on the waters or on the banks or shores of any waters.
- (3) Spear any game fish except that white bass, yellow bass, rock bass, panfish and bullheads may be speared while skin diving or scuba diving in inland waters during the open season for rough fish spearing on waters specified in s. NR 20.20.

NR 20.10 Special sturgeon spearing restrictions. No person may do any of the following:

- (1) Take, capture, kill or attempt to take, capture or kill sturgeon on Lake Winnebago system waters by any means other than spearing with a spear thrown by hand from inside a fishing shelter placed on the ice during the open season specified in s. NR 20.20 (73)(e).
- (2) Fish with or possess a fishing pole, hook and line or other similar devices that might be used for the purpose of catching fish within any fishing shelter containing an ice hole larger than 12 inches in diameter or square during the open season for spearing sturgeon on waters specified in s. NR 20.20(73)(e).
- (3) Cover ice holes cut, used or maintained for sturgeon spearing pursuant to s. NR 20.11(2) with a fishing shelter except during the period from 48 hours before and continuing through the open season for sturgeon spearing.
- (4) Possess a validated sturgeon carcass tag unless it is attached to a legally killed sturgeon while sturgeon spearing.
- (5) Possess a speared sturgeon unless immediately validating the sturgeon carcass tag by splitting the marks designating the month, day, time and location of kill. Failure to completely validate the sturgeon carcass tag renders the possession of the sturgeon illegal and the sturgeon carcass tag invalid. A sturgeon carcass tag shall be issued with each sturgeon spearing license and shall remain intact until the spearer spears a sturgeon.
- (6) Transport any sturgeon in or on any motor-driven vehicle from the time the sturgeon is taken to the time it is lawfully registered pursuant to sub. (9) unless the sturgeon is carried openly exposed and in a manner so that the sturgeon carcass tag attached to the sturgeon cannot be handled or manipulated by any occupant of the vehicle.
- (7) Possess a speared sturgeon unless the person who spears and tags the sturgeon accompanies the sturgeon carcass during transport until the sturgeon has been registered pursuant to sub. (9).
- (8) Possess a sturgeon speared from lakes Butte des Morts, Poygan or Winneconne under s. NR 20.20(73)(e)2.b. outside the following area unless the sturgeon has been registered pursuant to sub. (9): from the intersection of highways 110 and 21 in Oshkosh west on highway 21 to highway 116; north on highway 116 to county highway

B; west on county highway B to county highway D; west on county highway D to highway 49; north on highway 49 to county highway H; east on county highway H to highway 10; east on highway 10 to highway 110; south on highway 110 to county highway M; south on county highway M to highway 116; east on highway 116 to highway 110; south on highway 110 to highway 21.

- (9) Possess a sturgeon speared from Lake Winnebago under s. NR 20.20(73)(e)2.c. outside the following area unless the sturgeon has been registered pursuant to sub. (9): from the intersection of highways 10 and 114 in Menasha, east on highway 114 to highway 55; south on highway 55 to U.S. highway 151; south on U.S. highway 151 to Scott street in Fond du Lac; west on Scott street to highway 45; north on highway 45 to Main street in Oshkosh; north on Main street to Waugoo avenue; east on Waugoo avenue to Bowen street; north on Bowen street to North Shore drive; north on North Shore drive to county highway A; north on county highway A to highway 114 in Neenah; east on highway 114 to the intersection of highways 10 and 114 in Menasha.
- (10) Possess a sturgeon unless each person who has speared a sturgeon during the open season for spearing sturgeon shall exhibit the sturgeon, with the person's sturgeon carcass tag attached as required by s. 29.237, Stats., to a warden or other authorized department personnel at an official sturgeon registration station. Sturgeon shall be intact and registered at a station on Lake Winnebago if speared in Lake Winnebago. Sturgeon shall be intact and registered at a station on Lake Butte des Morts, Winneconne or Poygan if speared in Lake Butte des Morts, Winneconne or Poygan if speared in Lake Butte des Morts, Winneconne or Poygan. Sturgeon shall be exhibited at a sturgeon registration station not later than 6:00 p.m. on the day speared. The registration tag shall remain attached and locked to the sturgeon until the carcass is prepared for final consumption.
- (11) Attempt to register a sturgeon unless the license information can be verified. The station operator shall complete and retain the registration portion of the sturgeon license, lock a registration tag to the carcass immediately in front of the tail and remove the validation portion of the sturgeon carcass tag leaving the remainder of the sturgeon carcass tag attached to the sturgeon.
- NR 20.11 Ice fishing and fishing shelter restrictions. (1) No person may construct, place, use, maintain or occupy a fishing shelter on the ice of any waters of this state unless:
- (a) The name and residential address in the English language of the person owning or using the fishing shelter is legibly painted or permanently affixed on the outside of the fishing shelter with block lettering a minimum of one inch square and in contrasting colors.
 - (b) The door can be readily opened from the outside while the shelter is occupied.
- (c) The person is actively using the fishing shelter and it is removed from the ice daily and when not in use on the Fox river downstream from the DePere dam, Brown county.
- (d) The fishing shelter is removed from the ice daily and when not in use after March 5 on inland waters south of highway 64.
- (e) The fishing shelter is removed from the ice daily when not in use after March 15 on inland waters north of highway 64 and all other outlying waters.

- (2) No person may cut, use or maintain a hole larger than 12 inches in diameter or square for the taking of fish in any manner through the ice except for spearing fish in Lake Superior, sturgeon spearing, taking fish with dip nets, taking minnows with minnow traps or skin or scuba diving.
- (3) The department or its agents may direct that fishing shelters be removed from the ice by a date earlier than specified in subs. (1)(d) or (1)(e) if it has reason to believe that the ice has become unsafe for travel.

NR 20.12 Setline and set or bank pole restrictions. (1) GENERAL RESTRICTIONS. No person may use, set, lift, attend or possess any set or bank pole or setline on any water unless:

- (a) Its use is specifically authorized by a set or bank pole license issued under s. 29.531(1), Stats., or a setline license issued under s. 29.533(1), Stats. No person may use, set, lift, attend or possess set or bank pole or setline licensed to another person.
 - (b) Its use in that water is specifically authorized in s. NR 20.20.
- (c) A white setline flag at least 10 inches square bearing the number of the license authorizing its use in figures at least 3 inches high and attached to a flag staff that extends at least 3 feet above the surface of the water or bank is placed and maintained at one end of the setline. The flag staff may not exceed 2 1/2 inches in diameter and shall be marked with 2 inch to 6 inch wide alternating horizontal black and white bands. When a buoy is used to hold the setline's flag staff the buoy shall be cylindrical in shape, 15 inches or less in diameter and marked with 2 inch to 6 inch wide alternating horizontal black and white bands. No person may place a setline flag, flag staff or pole in the main channel of any navigable waterway.
- (d) A metal tag stamped with the number of the license authorizing its use is securely attached directly to each set or bank pole and to the flag staff of each setline.
 - (2) GEAR, FISHING METHODS AND BAIT. No person may do any of the following:
 - (a) Use, set, lift, attend or possess more than 5 set or bank poles.
- (b) Use, set, lift, attend or possess more than one setline while on the waters of this state except as provided in ss. NR 21.12(1) (a) and 22.12(1).
- (c) Use, set, lift or attend a set or bank pole equipped with more than one line, which may not have more than 2 hooks.
 - (d) Use, set, lift or attend a setline with more than 25 hooks.
- (e) Use, set, lift, attend or possess any set or bank pole or setline between one-half hour after sunset and one-half hour before sunrise.
- (f) Use or set a set or bank pole or setline unless it is lifted and the catch removed at least once each day following the day it was set unless a longer period is authorized by the department or its agents.
- (g) Use, set, lift or attend a set or bank pole or setline while in possession of hook and line fishing equipment.
- (h) Use, set, lift or attend a set or bank pole or setline that has stainless steel hooks or is equipped with any hooks that have a gap between the shank and the point smaller than ¾ inch except that on the Mississippi river stainless steel hooks may be used and there is no hook size restriction.
- (i) Use whole or live fish as bait on set or bank poles or setlines on Lakes Butte des Morts, Little Butte des Morts, Winnebago and Winneconne, Winnebago county, Lake

Poygan, Waushara and Winnebago counties and the Black river, Jackson, LaCrosse and Trempealeau counties.

- (j) Use live crawfish or whole or live fish less than 5 inches in length as bait on set or bank poles or setlines
- (3) RESTRICTIONS ON HARVEST. (a) No person may take, retain, kill or possess any fish or other animal taken on a set or bank pole or setline other than catfish, rough fish or turtles.

Note: All game fish taken on any set or bank pole or setline shall be immediately returned to the water except catfish taken in compliance with this section.

- (b) The size, bag and possession limits for catfish and rough fish established in s. NR 20.20 shall apply to all persons who fish with set or bank poles or setlines.
- (4) SALE OF FISH AND TURTLES. No person may sell any fish or other animal taken on a set or bank pole or setline except the following:
 - (a) Rough fish.
 - (b) Turtles.
- (c) Catfish taken from lakes Winnebago, Butte des Morts, Little Butte des Morts, Winneconne, Poygan, the Fox river downstream from lake Butte des Morts to the DePere dam, and the Wolf river from 500 feet below the Shawano dam downstream to its mouth.

NR 20.13 General netting restrictions. No person may do any of the following:

- (1) Possess, control or operate in any manner any net, seine or similar device that might be used for the purposes of fishing at any time while on any water or on the banks or shores of any water except as specifically authorized in this section, s. NR 20.14 or s. NR 20.20.
- (2) Set, use or operate a dip net or seine from sunset to sunrise unless specifically authorized in s. NR 20.20.
 - (3) Set, use or operate more than one dip net.
- (4) Set, use or operate a dip net in any manner other than by raising and lowering it vertically while fishing.
 - (5) Fish in any other manner while operating a dip net or seine.
 - (6) Fish with hook and line from any boat that has a dip net attached.
- (7) Leave a dip net or seine unattended within 25 feet of the edge of the water on outlying waters, Lake Michigan tributaries, Green bay and its tributaries.
 - (8) Sell, barter or trade in any manner any sucker taken with a dip net or seine.

NR 20.14 Minnow collecting restrictions. No person may do any of the following:

- (1) Set, use or operate any net, trap or similar device for the taking of minnows other than minnow seines, minnow dip nets and minnow traps as authorized in s. NR 20.20 unless issued a permit by the department under s. NR 20.39 pursuant to s. 29.516(1), Stats.
- (2) Set, use, or operate any minnow seine, minnow dip net, minnow trap or similar device for the taking of minnows in any water unless specifically authorized in s. NR 20.20 or s. NR 20.39. Minnow seines or minnow dip nets of any type or description may not be set, used or operated in any trout stream unless a permit is issued by the department under s. NR 20.39.

- (3) Set, use or operate minnow traps in any water that has been chemically treated to reestablish a trout fishery.
- (4) Set, use or operate minnow traps unless a label or tag bearing the legible name and address of the operator in the English language is securely attached.
- (5) Set, use or operate minnow traps unless they are raised and the minnows are removed from them at least once every 48 hours from all waters except trout streams.
- (6) Set, use or operate minnow traps in trout streams during the closed season for trout except licensed bait dealers issued a permit by the department under s. NR 20.39. The permit authorizing placement of minnow traps in trout streams during the closed season for trout shall specify conditions on raising the traps and removing minnows.
- (7) Set, use or operate more than 3 minnow traps in trout streams during the open season for trout except licensed bait dealers.
- (a) No more than a total of 20 minnow traps may be set, used or operated by licensed bait dealers during the open season for trout when removing minnows from one or more trout streams unless issued a permit by the department under s. NR 20.39.
- (b) Minnow traps set, used or operated on trout streams during the open season for trout shall be raised and the minnows removed from them at least once every 24 hours.
- (8) Possess or control more than 600 minnows at any time unless licensed as a bait dealer under s. 29.509, Stats.

Note: The possession and transportation of legally taken minnows is permitted throughout the state.

Subchapter II

Authorized Methods, Open Seasons, Daily Bag Limits and Size Restrictions on Specified Waters

NR 20.15 Early catch and release season for trout. Except where specifically restricted in s. NR 20.20, there is an open season for trout in all streams from March 1 at 5:00 a.m. to the Friday immediately preceding the first Saturday in May at 6 p.m. during 1997, 1998 and 1999 but the daily bag limit and possession limit for trout is 0 and only artificial lures with barbless hooks may be used for any species of fish while fishing on trout streams during this period.

Note: The early catch and release seasons during 1997, 1998 and 1999 do not apply to spring ponds, ponds or lakes.

Subchapter III Department Authority

- NR 20.25 License waiver. (1) On the first Saturday and consecutive Sunday of June each year, no fishing license is required to fish the inland or outlying waters, pursuant to s. 29.197(3), Stats.
 - (2) The license waiver of sub. (1) does not apply to commercial fishing license requirements.
- NR 20.30 Department permitted to take fish. No provision in this chapter prohibits the department, its agents, wardens or representatives of the bureau of fisheries management and habitat protection from taking any of the fish mentioned at any time they deem it advisable and necessary to promote the general conservation progress.

NR 20.33 Special open and closed seasons. (1) SEASON CLOSURE UNDER UNUSUAL CONDITIONS.

- (a) Water level reduction. Pursuant to par. (e), the department may close the season for fishing in all or part of any inland water which has experienced sudden water level reduction or where a sudden reduction is imminent as a result of dam failure, draw down or other loss of water supply. The closed season shall remain in full force and effect until the department determines that the water has been returned to its original level and the season is open pursuant to par. (e) 2. The department may close the season when it finds after scientific investigation and study, that all of the following have occurred:
- 1. Game fish have been or will be unusually concentrated due to the drop in water level and may, therefore, be more vulnerable to angler harvest.
- 2. The remaining game fish population structure cannot easily be replaced if subjected to continued angler harvest.
 - 3. Water levels are expected to eventually return to normal.

Continued sport fishing may result in a depletion of the game fish supply.

- 5. Closure of the season is necessary to conserve the game fish supply until water levels are restored and to insure the citizens of this state continued opportunities for good fishing.
- (b) Fish concentrated under ice. Pursuant to par. (e), the department may close the season for fishing through the ice in all or part of any inland water. The closed season shall remain in full force and effect until the water is no longer covered with ice and the season is opened pursuant to par. (e) 2. The department may close the season when it finds, after scientific investigation and study, that all of the following apply:
- 1. The body of water is not expected to experience significant loss of its game fish population due to loss of oxygen.
- 2. Ice cover has caused an unusual concentration of game fish, increasing their vulnerability to angler harvest.
 - 3. Continued sport fishing would deplete the supply of game fish.
- 4. A closed season is necessary to conserve the game fish supply and insure the citizens of this state continued opportunities for good fishing;
- (c) Fishery rehabilitation. Pursuant to par. (e), the department may close the season for fishing in all or part of any inland water in which fish have been removed or destroyed as a result of a rehabilitation program, to reestablish a good supply of game fish and insure the citizens of this state future opportunities for good fishing. The closed season shall remain in full force and effect until opened pursuant to par. (e) 2., scientific investigation indicates the game fish population has achieved a harvestable surplus of fish of desirable size, and reopening the season does not conflict with the closed seasons for each species specified in sub. (1).

- (d) Presence of nonindigenous species. Pursuant to par. (e), the department may close the season for all bait harvest in all or part of any water that has been documented to contain detrimental species that are not indigenous to the waters of the state in order to prevent the further transport of nonindigenous species to other waters of the state. The department shall open the season pursuant to par. (e) 2., if the department determines that the nonindigenous species is no longer present or the nonindigenous species no longer poses a threat to other waters of the state.
- (e) Closing and reopening seasons. 1. A closed season under par. (a), (b), (c) or (d) shall become effective only after one or more public informational meetings are held by the department. The closed season shall be put into effect by publication of a notice in the state newspaper, posting the notice on or in the vicinity of the shore of the water affected, and by providing any other notice which the department deems reasonable.
- 2. A closed season under par. (a), (b), (c) or (d) shall be discontinued only after publication of a notice in the state newspaper and removal of the notices posted on or in the vicinity of the shore of the water affected.
- (2) URBAN FISHING PROGRAM. The department may establish an urban fishing program by posting the open and closed seasons on specified waters. The department shall post notice on the affected waters that a special fishing season applies. The notice shall state the name or description of the water to which the special fishing season applies, the persons permitted to fish during the special fishing season and the time period of the special fishing season. The department may designate or remove a body of water in accordance with the requirements of s. 29.053(2) (a), Stats.
- (3) TEMPORARY DIP NETTING AUTHORIZATION. The department shall open the season for fishing with dip nets in any waters when it finds after scientific investigation and study that the fish populations in the waters are threatened with imminent mortality because of depletion of dissolved oxygen or other adverse habitat conditions under which fish will not survive. During the open season all species of fish may be taken by means of dip nets not more than 3 feet in diameter or 3 feet square, but no person may have more than 25 pounds and one fish of any species of game fish of any size in possession. No person may fish with more than one dip net. The open season shall be put into effect by posting a notice thereof on or in the vicinity of the shore of the waters affected, the posting being deemed by the department to be the most feasible way of notifying the public that the open season for fishing with dip nets is in effect. The open season shall remain in full force and effect only so long as the waters are covered with ice and so long as the posting is continued.
- (4) FISHERY REHABILITATION. The department may open the season for fishing with dip nets, minnow seines or spears in waters for which a permit for treatment with a toxicant has been issued. During the open season all species of fish of any size may be taken with no bag or possession limit. The open season shall be from the date of issuance of said permit until the commencement of treatment and shall be put into effect by posting a notice thereof on or in the vicinity of the waters affected and by publication in one or more newspapers having wide circulation in the area affected.
- NR 20.35 Alternate size and bag limits. (1) PURPOSE. Notwithstanding any provision of either ch. NR 21, 22, 23 or this chapter, for all or part of any inland, boundary or outlying water, the department may apply the alternative size limits, bag limits or both under this section for fish species identified in order to provide for better use and management of the fishery resource of the water to which the proposed alternate limit would apply.
- (2) PROCEDURE. The department shall follow the following procedures in applying an alternate size limit or bag limit under this section:
- (a) Notice. The department shall prepare and distribute a notice of its intent to apply an alternate limit under this section. The notice shall be published as a class 1 notice under ch. 985, Stats., in a general circulation newspaper in the vicinity of the water and, if the proposal has statewide significance,

in the official state newspaper. A copy of the notice shall be sent to individuals and organizations which the department believes may be interested in the matter. The notice shall include a description of the water affected, the fish species affected, the alternate limit which will apply, and the date the alternate limit will take effect. The notice shall invite the public to submit written comments and indicate that a public information meeting will be held on the alternate limit if requested in writing within 10 days after the notice is published.

- (b) Public information meeting. If a public information meeting is requested under par. (a), the department shall conduct the public information meeting in the vicinity of the affected water. At the meeting the department shall describe the factual basis for its intended decision and shall receive comments from the public on the matter.
- (c) Determination. If, based on facts and information available to it, including comments received in response to the notice and at any public information meeting which may be held, the department concludes that a condition described in sub. (3) affects fish in a specific water, it shall apply the corresponding alternate limit. The alternate limit shall take effect upon the posting of the notice under par. (d).
- (d) *Posting*. The department shall post notice at public access sites on the affected water that an alternate limit applies to a species of fish found in that water. The notice shall set out the name or description of the water or that part of the water to which the proposed alternate limit would apply, the species of fish affected, the corresponding alternate limit and the effective date of the alternate limit.
- (e) List. The department shall maintain a current list of all waters to which an alternate limit under this section applies. The list shall be available for public inspection at the department's central office during regular office hours.

Note: The list will be available for review at the offices of the bureau of fisheries management and habitat protection, 101 South Webster Street, Madison, WI

- (3) ALTERNATE LIMIT. (a) Size limits. No size limit shall apply to walleye, largemouth bass or smallmouth bass if, for the particular species in a particular water, the department finds that at least one of the following conditions exist:
- 1. Angler exploitation of the species is less than 15% of the population of fish larger than the original size limit.
 - 2. Total adult mortality for that species is less than 30% of the population.
- 3. More than 10% of the fish tested of that species in the size range from the originally applicable size limit to 3 inches larger than the originally applicable size limit, in fillets with the skin on, contain .75 parts per million or more mercury, 2 parts per million or more PCB (polychlorinated biphenyl), 5 parts per million or more DDT (dichloro diphenyl trichloroethane), 5 parts per million or more Toxaphene, 0.3 parts per million or more Chlordane, or 0.3 parts per million or more Dieldrin.
- 4. Walleye males do not grow to a length of at least 13 inches in 4 years or largemouth bass or smallmouth bass do not grow to a length of at least 12 inches in 5 years in all inland waters lying north of a line beginning at the state highway 70 bridge over the St. Croix river, then east on state highway 70 to its intersection with state highway 27, then south on highway 27 to its intersection with state highway 64, then east along highway 64 to its end, then continuing east to the waters of Green Bay or in inland waters of Brown, Kewaunee or Door counties north of a line beginning with the state highway 29 bridge over the Fox river, then east along state highway 29 to its end, then continuing east to Lake Michigan.
- 5. Largemouth bass or smallmouth bass do not grow to a length of at least 14 inches in 6 years in inland waters other than those identified in subd. 4.
- (b) Bag limits. If the department finds under sub. (2) that one or more of the following conditions exists in a particular water, the corresponding alternate bag limit shall apply to the named species of fish in that water.

- (4) TERMINATION OF ALTERNATE LIMITS. Any time the department has reason to believe that the condition which led to the application of an alternate limit under this section no longer affects a species of fish in a particular water, it may remove the alternate limit by following the procedures under sub. (2) (a) to (c). Following its determination to remove an alternate limit the department shall remove or modify the posted notices of alternate limits and the original bag limit or size limit shall then apply.
- NR 20.36 Modifications in daily bag limit and minimum size limit in response to tribal harvest. (1) ADJUSTMENT. In order to prevent a total harvest of more than 35% of the adult walleye population or 27% of the adult muskellunge population, the secretary may lower the daily bag limit on walleye and increase the minimum size limit for muskellunge in specific waters in response to the harvest goals of the Chippewa bands for their spear, net or trap fisheries. The adjusted daily bag and size limits shall be in effect until March 1 of the year following the tribal harvest. The safe harvest levels on individual waters shall be determined by the department.
- (a) Walleyes. The daily bag limit will be reduced when the department is notified by the Chippewa bands of their harvest goals on individual waters. The extent of the reduction depends upon the percent of the safe harvest they intend to take and the age of the population estimate used to determine the safe harvest or if a regression model was used to determine the safe harvest. The daily bag limits to be used with the different percentages and for various basis of determining the safe harvest are as follows:

(b) Muskellunge. The minimum size limit will be increased when the department is notified by the Chippewa bands that their harvest goal on an individual water is 60% or more of the safe harvest. The minimum size limits to be used with different percentages of the safe harvest are as follows:

- (2) READJUSTMENT. After May 30 of each year, the secretary may raise the daily bag limit or reduce the minimum size limit to the limit specified as appropriate using the percent of the safe harvest level expected to be harvested through March 1 of the next year as indicated in sub. (1). If actual harvest subsequently exceeds the expected harvest level, the daily bag limit for walleye may be reduced or the minimum size limit for muskellunge may be increased the following year to reflect actual harvest for that year and harvest goals of the Chippewa bands for the next year. If a new population estimate is made, the safe harvest level shall be changed accordingly and the secretary may adjust the daily bag limit or minimum size limit according to the percentage of the new safe harvest level that is expected to be harvested as indicated in sub. (1), where deemed necessary to remain consistent with the safety factors established under *Lac Courte Oreilles v. State of Wis.*, 707 F. Supp. 1034 (W. D. Wis. 1989). The readjusted daily bag and size limits shall be in effect until March 1 of the year following the tribal harvest.
- (3) DAILY BAG AND POSSESSION LIMITS. (a) Reduced daily bag limits calculated pursuant to this section are individual lake limits and may be combined, but no person may exceed a total daily bag limit of 5 walleyes and no person may possess or have under control more than the possession limit of 10 walleyes.
- (b) While fishing no person may possess fish on any water in excess of the bag limit or under the size limit for that water.
- (4) NOTICE. Adjustments and readjustments of bag limits and minimum size limits under subs. (1) and (2) shall become effective upon publication of the adjustment or readjustment in the official newspaper in the area affected.
- NR 20.37 Special size and bag limits for Lac du Flambeau reservation. Bag and size limits may be established by the secretary if agreements are reached with the Lac du Flambeau band which limit their off-reservation harvest declarations to a level allowing a state walleye bag limit of 3 when calculated pursuant to s. NR 20.36. Adjustments to the on-reservation bag and size limits shall become effective upon publication of the adjustments in the official newspapers of Vilas and Oneida counties.
- NR 20.38 Control of detrimental fish. The department finds, pursuant to s. 29.424(1), Stats., that the following fish species are detrimental in the waters specified. The department may remove them from the waters specified or cause them to be removed, pursuant to ss. 29.421 and 29.417, Stats.:
- (1) BULLHEADS. The department finds that bullheads are detrimental in the following waters: (a) All waters in Barron, Burnett, Chippewa, Langlade, Lincoln, Marathon, Oneida, Polk, Price, Rusk, Sawyer, Taylor, Vilas and Washburn counties.
 - (b) Adams and Juneau counties. Castle Rock flowage and the Wisconsin river beginning at the

Petenwell dam and extending downstream to the Castle Rock dam except for that part of the Yellow river in Castle Rock flowage locally called the Buckhorn area, upstream from the electric power transmission line across the flowage in sections 26 and 35, T17N, R4E, Juneau county.

- (c) *Dodge county*. Beaver Dam lake and the Rock river from hwy. 49 downstream to the dam in Hustisford.
- (d) Florence county. Bass, Frog, Halsey, Long (Forest county), Scout and West Bass lakes; Line and Pine river flowages.
 - (e) Forest county. Little Rice lake.
 - (f) Lafayette county. Yellowstone lake.
 - (g) Marinette county. Town Corner lake.
- (h) Outagamie county. Fox river from the upper dam in Appleton upstream to Little Lake Butte des Morts.
 - (i) Sheboygan county. Sheboygan marsh.
- (j) Winnebago county. Little Lake Butte des Morts from the lower dam on the Fox river at Menasha to the upper dam in Appleton, Outagamie county.
- (k) Wood county. Petenwell flowage and the Wisconsin river beginning at the Nekoosa dam in Wood county extending downstream to the Petenwell dam in Adams and Juneau counties.
- (1) All waters of Lake Michigan and Green Bay in Marinette, Oconto, Brown, Door, Kewaunee, Manitowoc, Sheboygan, Ozaukee, Milwaukee, Racine and Kenosha counties.
- (2) PERCH. The department finds that perch are detrimental in the following waters: (a) *Vilas county*. Landing lake, Mill lake, North Twin lake, Rice lake (Sec. 14, T40-41N, R9E), South Twin lake, High lake and Fishtrap lake.
- (3) CATFISH. The department finds that catfish are detrimental in the following waters: (a) Green Lake county. Green lake.
 - (b) All waters of Lake Michigan and Green Bay.
- (4) PANFISH. The department finds that panfish are detrimental in the following waters: (a) Washburn county. All waters in the Township of Chicog.
 - (b) Oneida county. Crescent lake (sections 8, 16, 17, 18, 20, 21, T36N, R8E) and Stella lake.
- (5) WHITE BASS. The department finds that white bass are detrimental in the following waters:
 (a) All waters of Lake Michigan and Green Bay.
- (6) NONINDIGENOUS FISHES. The department finds that all fish species, strains or hybrids that are not indigenous to the waters of the state are detrimental fish in all waters of the state except where their presence is specifically permitted under s. 29.745, Stats.
- NR 20.39 Permits for use of nonstandard minnow gear on inland waters. (1) The department may issue a permit to a licensed bait dealer for the taking of minnows with minnow seines, minnow dip nets or minnow traps which are otherwise prohibited by s. NR 20.14. Permits authorizing placement of minnow traps in trout streams during the closed season for trout shall specify conditions on raising the traps and removing minnows. Applications shall be submitted on forms available from the department to the regional office having jurisdiction over the affected waters.
- (a) The department shall issue the permit if it determines that the conditions of this paragraph are met.
- 1. For waters with adequate public access according to s. NR 1.90 (2) (a), the department shall determine if:
 - a. The department does not need the minnows for its fish management activities;
- b. Removal of the minnows will not cause or substantially contribute to a long-term depletion of the forage base;

- c. Threatened or endangered species listed in ch. NR 27 are not known to be present in or near the affected water;
- d. Unique or sensitive biological values such as nesting loons or heron rookeries are not present in, on or near the affected water;
- e. The use of the minnow seines, minnow dip nets or minnow traps is not likely to hinder or interfere with the exercise of a permit issued earlier in the year to another person for the water; and
- f. The use of the minnow seines, minnow dip nets or minnow traps is not likely to hinder or interfere with any other public uses of the water.
- 2. For waters lacking adequate public access and for waters surrounded by private lands, the department shall determine if:
 - a. The requirements of subd. 1.a. to e. are met; and
- b. The applicant provided the department with the name, mailing address and telephone number of the person granting the applicant legal access to the water.
 - (b) Permits issued by the department under this subsection shall:
 - 1. Include the permit holder's name, address and bait dealer's license number,
 - 2. Specify the water where the permit is valid,
 - 3. Describe the minnow seines, minnow dip nets or minnow traps authorized,
- 4. Include an expiration date of December 31 of the calendar year in which the permit is issued, unless an earlier date is set under par. (c),
 - 5. Prohibit the removal or destruction of vegetation, logs and other habitat features,
- 6. Require that minnows be transported only in tanks equipped with either an oxygen tank or an adequate aeration system,
- 7. Require that transport tanks and holding facilities not be loaded beyond their capacity to keep the minnows alive and healthy,
- 8. Require that all minnows taken under the permit be sold or used only for angling or rearing of fish in department or private fish hatcheries, and
- 9. Require that all minnows which are not kept for use or sale and all game fish caught by the minnow seines, minnow dip nets or minnow traps be promptly returned unharmed to the water.
- (c) The department may require reporting of the permit holder's activities under the permit and may set reasonable permit conditions to insure that the requirements of par. (a) are met.
- (d) The department shall act on a complete application for a permit under this section within 20 business days after it is received by the appropriate department regional office.
- (e) No permit holder may cause or allow the violation of any term or condition of a permit issued under this section. In addition to any other penalties, if a permit holder is convicted of causing or allowing a violation of any term or condition of a permit, the permit is terminated.
- (f) The department may, at any time, revoke or modify a permit issued under this section if it determines that the minnow supply is in danger of being depleted in the water for which the permit was issued. A permit revocation or modification shall become effective when it is received by the permit holder or 3 business days after it is mailed to the permit holder at the address shown on the permit, whichever occurs first.
- (g) Any person aggrieved by a decision of the department under this section may, within 30 days of the mailing of the decision, request a contested-case hearing before the department on the decision under s. 227.42, Stats.

NR 20.40 Fishing tournaments. (1) DEFINITIONS. In this section:

(a) "Fishing tournament" means any organized fishing activity, on any water of the state where competition is the primary intent, where prizes are awarded which, in total, have a value of more than \$500, where the total number of participants is greater than 40 individuals or 20 boats, where the waters

to be fished are identified by name by the sponsor, and where participants are required to fish on the same dates.

- (b) "Person" means any individual, partnership, association, organization or body politic or corporate.
- (c) "Sponsor" means a person who advances, conducts, directs, establishes, organizes, promotes or otherwise is responsible for the operation of a fishing tournament, but does not include a person who only assists in advertising or publicizing another person's fishing tournament. "Sponsor" also means to advance, conduct, direct, establish, organize, promote or otherwise be responsible for the operation of a fishing tournament.
- (2) PERMIT REQUIRED. No person may sponsor a fishing tournament without first obtaining a permit from the department.
- (3) APPLICATION. A person who wishes to sponsor a fishing tournament shall apply to the department for a permit on forms available from the department. The application shall be submitted no sooner than one calendar year before the starting date of the tournament and no later than 30 days before the starting date of the tournament.

Note: Application forms may be obtained at no charge from department service centers and regional offices.

- (4) ACTION ON APPLICATIONS. (a) The department shall act on fishing tournament permit applications no later than 10 business days following receipt of a complete application.
 - (b) Permits shall be granted unless the sponsor's privilege has been revoked pursuant to sub. (9).
- (5) COMPLIANCE. All participants in a permitted tournament shall comply with all provisions of the permit. In the event that a participant clearly fails to comply with the permit, the violating participant shall promptly be disqualified or expelled from the tournament by the sponsor. The department may impose penalties under sub. (9) and take other appropriate enforcement action against the violating participant.
- (6) GENERAL PROVISIONS AND PERMIT CONDITIONS. (a) No person may sponsor fishing tournaments on the same body of water with starting dates separated by less than 2 weeks.
- (b) No person may sponsor a fishing tournament for a particular species of fish on the opening weekend of any fishing season for that species on any water subject to the opening.
 - (c) All permits for fishing tournaments shall:
 - 1. Identify areas where competitive fishing is prohibited for the following reasons:
- a. To protect critical habitat, including areas designated by local ordinance for aquatic vegetation preservation or areas where habitat enhancement activity is underway, and
- b. To protect public rights, interests or safety, including designated swimming areas, mooring areas, access areas, navigational channels, staging areas, beaches or other special use areas.
- 2. Specify the method for fish holding and release for tournaments where fish are reduced to possession, usually for purposes of recording, and live fish are then released to the water from which they came.

Note: NR 20.10 (5) provides for permits for restocking.

- 3. Contain provisions for other than live release of fish when the department determines that weather conditions and water temperature are not conducive to survival of fish intended for release and the release may constitute malicious waste of natural resources under the provisions of s. 23.095 (1), Stats.
- 4. Prohibit the use of tagged fish, except when approved by the department to enhance collection of data for management purposes as part of a scientific study, or when tagged fish are legally obtained from a licensed private fish hatchery and are planted under a stocking or introduction permit issued by the department under s. 29.745, Stats., and s. NR 19.05.

- (d) Pursuant to s. NR 20.05(7) any fish taken into actual possession by an individual and not released immediately shall be included as part of the individual's daily bag limit.
- (e) The time limitations upon the length of a fishing tournament under this section do not include fishing activities by tournament participants carried out prior to the time when the tournament begins.
- (f) Except for tournaments on the Great Lakes, the fishing portion of any tournament may not run for more than 10 consecutive hours each day or more than 3 consecutive days.
 - (g) The fishing portion of tournaments on the Great Lakes is not limited.
- (7) REPORTING. Each sponsor shall report the results of the sponsor's tournament and other information which the department deems necessary on forms available from the department no later than 30 days following the last day of the tournament.

Note: Reporting forms will be issued with permits.

- (8) PENALTIES. In addition to any penalties provided by law, the department shall, for a period of 2 years from the date of violation, deny any tournament fishing permit application submitted by a person it determines failed to comply with a tournament fishing permit or with a rule relating to tournament fishing.
 - (9) SUNSET. This section shall remain in effect until December 31, 2001.
- NR 20.41 Experimental waters. (1) DESIGNATED. The following waters are designated as experimental waters: Nebish, Spruce, Mystery, Escanaba and Pallette lakes situated in sections 34 and 35, township 42 north, range 7 east, and sections 1, 2, 3, 10, 11 and 12, township 41 north, range 7 east, Vilas county.
- (2) PERMIT REQUIRED. (a) No person may fish in experimental waters unless a permit has been issued to the person by the department.

Note: Permits may be obtained at the checking station indicated by posted signs in the immediate area of these experimental waters.

- (b) Permits issued under this section are valid only for the date issued.
- (3) REPORTING. (a) Permits issued under this section shall be returned to the checking station upon termination of fishing activities by the angler.
- (b) All fish taken pursuant to this section shall be exhibited to the department or its agents at the checking station for examination, identification and marking.
- NR 20.60 Monthly sport trolling fishing reports. (1) A monthly sport trolling fishing report form required by s. 29.514 (2), Stats., shall be completed by the sport trolling licensee guiding persons in sport trolling. Copies of the report form shall be provided by the department. The licensee's name, license number, date, locations fished, number of anglers, number of lines fished, hours fished, total number of fish caught and other information required by the report form shall be accurately and legibly recorded on the form in the English language within 1/2 hour after completing each trip's fishing activities after returning to the dock or shore. The number of fish of each species caught and the tag numbers, if any, may be recorded on the form after returning to the dock or shore but shall be recorded on the form prior to midnight of the day of each trip. The report form shall be exhibited to a conservation warden upon request.
- (2) The entire monthly sport trolling fishing report form provided by the department, including any voided and unused pages, shall be signed and dated by the sport trolling licensee and submitted to the department on or before the 10th day of each month for the preceding calendar month.
- NR 20.65 Report of licensed guides. All Wisconsin guides licensed under the provisions of s. 29.512(1), Stats., and operating in the Wisconsin waters of Lake Superior, Lake Michigan and Green Bay shall report to the department on blanks to be furnished by the department detailed information

- (2) The entire monthly sport trolling fishing report form provided by the department, including any voided and unused pages, shall be signed and dated by the sport trolling licensee and submitted to the department on or before the 10th day of each month for the preceding calendar month.
- NR 20.65 Report of licensed guides. All Wisconsin guides licensed under the provisions of s. 29.512(1), Stats., and operating in the Wisconsin waters of Lake Superior, Lake Michigan and Green Bay shall report to the department on blanks to be furnished by the department detailed information regarding their fishing activities which shall include the quantity, the varieties of fish taken, and any other information pertaining to their fishing activities required by the department.

SECTION 2. NR 21.02(16) is amended to read:

NR 21.02(16) Wisconsin-Minnesota boundary waters are those waters known as the Mississippi river lying west of the Burlington Northern and Santa Fe railroad main tracks on the east side of the Mississippi river, Lake St. Croix, the St. Croix river from the Burlington Northern and Santa Fe railroad bridge at Prescott, as far in a northerly direction as the St. Croix river forms and acts as boundary waters between the states of Wisconsin and Minnesota, and the St. Louis river including St. Louis bay and Superior bay from the north-south Wisconsin-Minnesota state boundary line downstream to an imaginary line drawn between the northwest bank of the Nemadji river where it forms a junction with Superior bay and northwest bank of the Superior entry channel where it forms a junction with Superior bay to the Lake Superior beach line in the Superior entry including St. Louis bay, Superior bay, Little Pokegama bay, Pokegama bay upstream to highway 105, Kimballs bay, Howard bay, Allouez bay and all other bays connected to the St. Louis river.

The foregoing rules were approved and adopted by the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board on January 27, 1999.

The rules shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin administrative register as provided in s. 227.22(2)(intro.), Stats.
