Whereas, he served on the Rice Lake police force for 14 years; and

Whereas, he gave his life in the line of duty while helping neighboring Rusk County officials as a member of the Barron County Emergency Response Team; and

Whereas, Mike will be remembered for his bright sense of humor, his devotion to his family and friends, his dedication to his community and his active membership in the Trinity Lutheran Church and Rice Lake Masonic Lodge; and

Whereas, Mike was an exemplary human being and police officer; now, therefore, be it

Baribeau's record of public service, express their deep sorrow at his death and extend their condolences to his family, friends and fellow police officers; and, be it further
