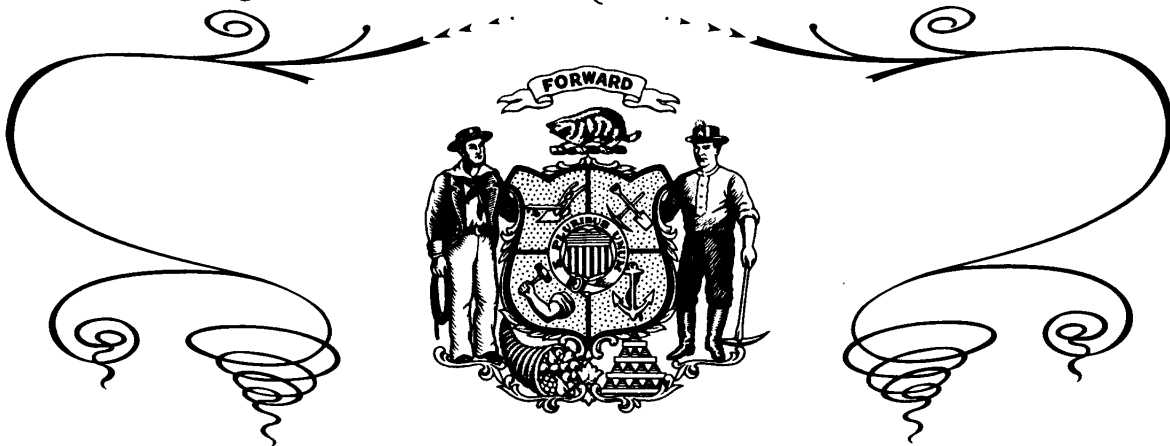

## ENGROSSED RESOLUTION

---

**Relating to:** proclaiming November 12 of each year as Alzheimer's Disease Awareness Day in Wisconsin.
