

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 27

WHEREAS, the State of Wisconsin is experiencing a disastrous number of deaths and injuries on its highways; and

WHEREAS, the greatest number of deaths and injuries have in the past occurred during the Labor Day weekend; and

WHEREAS, more motorists are expected to use Wisconsin highways during this period than ever before in the state's history; and

WHEREAS, an unconscionable number of citizens will be killed or injured on Wisconsin highways during the Labor Day Holiday period unless all available resources are utilized to support the highway safety effort;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, PATRICK J. LUCEY, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby declare a

STATE OF EMERGENCY

to exist in Wisconsin starting at 5:00 p.m., Thursday, September 2, 1971, until the extreme danger to safety on Wisconsin highways is abated, and urge all motorists traveling on Wisconsin highways to exercise extreme caution during this period to assist in reducing highway accidents.

FURTHER, under the authority contained in Section 21.11 of the Wisconsin Statutes, I hereby order into state service sufficient men and equipment of the Wisconsin National Guard as are necessary to assist the members of the Wisconsin State Traffic Patrol in the performance of their duties during the critical danger periods of the summer of 1971.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Wisconsin to be affixed. Done at the Capitol in the City of Madison this 2nd day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seventy-one.
