EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 59

WHEREAS, unusually heavy rains, commencing on June 25, 1978, and extending through July 6, 1978, were experienced in the Counties of Buffalo, Crawford, Dane, Green, Iowa, Juneau, La Crosse, Lafayette, Monroe, Pepin, Pierce, Richland, Rock, Sauk, Trempealeau and Vernon of Wisconsin, caused extensive flooding and serious erosion damage to highway facilities on the Federal Aid Systems; and

WHEREAS, such damage was sufficiently extensive to require immediate repairs; and

WHEREAS, such conditions constitute an emergency as contemplated in Sections 120(f), 125 and 315 of Title 23, U.S. Code;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARTIN J. SCHREIBER, Acting Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim that a

STATE OF EMERGENCY

exists in the above-mentioned counties of this state, and hereby request that the Secretary of Transportation of the United States concur in the declaration of this emergency.
