LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE SUMEAU

EXECUTIVE ORDER #176

Relating to the Creation of the Council on Youth Village - Milwaukee Development

WHEREAS, preparing Wisconsin's workforce for the jobs of the Twenty-First Century and providing new opportunities for our students are critically important to Wisconsin's economic and social future; and

WHEREAS, tech prep and youth apprenticeships must be combined with career and personal counseling in order to produce independent, self-sustaining individuals capable of assuming personal responsibility and becoming contributing members of society; and

WHEREAS, establishment of a residential facility will help foster the school to work transition for students experiencing difficulties in traditional classroom and home settings by providing an environment conducive for learning and succeeding;

NOW THEREFORE, I, TOMMY G. THOMPSON, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the laws of this State, and specifically by Wisconsin Statute section 14.019, do hereby:

- Establish the Council on Youth Village Milwaukee Development.
- Provide that the Council shall consist of not more than sixteen members appointed by the Governor to serve at his pleasure. A chairperson, selected from the members of the council, shall be appointed by the Governor, to serve at his pleasure.
- 3. Provide that the following state agencies shall provide informational assistance to the Council; Department of Administration, Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations, Department of Public Instruction and the Board of Vocational, Technical and Adult Education. Coordination and staffing for the Council shall be provided by the YMCA of Metropolitan Milwaukee.

4. Provide that the Council shall:

a. Make recommendations for the implementation of a youth village that includes the curriculum, objectives and operations of such a residential facility;

b. Study and recommend equitable and appropriate funding sources and mechanisms;

c. Identify and evaluate similar programs, including German model, which may provide insights into the development of a facility and program;

d. Report its findings to the Governor and the Legislature by December 31, 1993.
