EXECUTIVE ORDER # 13


Relating to a Special Election for the Twenty-first Assembly District and the Seventy-first Assembly District

WHEREAS, the Honorable Jeffrey Plale, submitted his resignation as a State Representative for the Twenty-first Assembly District, effective May 8, 2003; and


WHEREAS, the Honorable Julie M. Lassa, submitted her resignation as a State Representative for the Seventy-first Assembly District, effective May 8, 2003; and


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jim Doyle, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to section 8.50(4) of the Wisconsin Statutes, order that a special election be held on July 22, 2003 to fill the vacancies in the Twenty-first Assembly District and the Seventy-first Assembly District. A description of the boundaries of the Twenty-first Assembly District and the Seventy-first Assembly District as created in the combined cases of *Baumgart et al. v. Wendelberger*, Case No. 01-C-0121 (E.D. Wis. 2002) and *Jensen et al. v. Wendelberger*, Case No. 02-C-0366 (E.D. Wis. 2002) are set out in the 2001-02 Wisconsin Statutes following section 4.005. The terms for the Twenty-first and Seventy-first Assembly Districts will expire on the first Monday in January, 2005. If a primary is necessary, it shall be held on June 24, 2003. Circulation of nomination papers for candidates may begin on May 13, 2003 and nomination papers may be filed no later than 5:00 P.M., May 27, 2003 in the office of the State Elections Board. This election shall be held, conducted, canvassed and returned in accordance with law.
