EXECUTIVE ORDER #222

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin Be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Firefighter John C. Brocker of the Town of Oneida Volunteer Fire Department

WHEREAS, on Monday, October 31, 2016, John C. Brocker, a firefighter with the Town of Oneida Volunteer Fire Department in Oneida, Wisconsin, died at the age of sixty-five after responding to a vehicle emergency; and

WHEREAS, John C. Brocker volunteered as a firefighter for fourteen years and fire inspector for nine years with the Town of Oneida Volunteer Fire Department; and


WHEREAS, John C. Brocker leaves behind an honorable legacy of service to his community and his state, and the people of Wisconsin mourn his death; and

WHEREAS, a memorial service will be held for John C. Brocker in Seymour, Wisconsin, on Monday, November 7, 2016;


NOW THEREFORE, I, SCOTT WALKER, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by federal and state law, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds, and military installations of the State of Wisconsin equipped with such flags, beginning at sunrise on **Monday, November 7, 2016**, and ending at sunset on that date.
