2015 Wisconsin Act 193 [2015 Assembly Bill 684]

Department of Transportation Remedial Legislation

2015 Wisconsin Act 193 is remedial legislation, introduced by the Joint Legislative Council's Law Revision Committee at the request of the Department of Transportation (DOT).

The Act does the following:

- Repeals the statute that requires DOT to study the impact of raising the legal drinking age to 21 and report the results to the Legislature by January 1, 1988, 1989, 1990, and 1991.
- Repeals the statutory provisions relating to the occupational tax on controlled substances.
- Repeals the statute that requires the Secretary of DOT to determine whether the state
 is ready to fully implement the federal REAL ID Act. On November 30, 2012, DOT
 published the required notice that it was ready to fully implement the federal REAL
 ID Act effective January 1, 2013.
- Removes all references to the undetermined future date of the notice provided by DOT regarding full implementation of the federal REAL ID Act and inserts the appropriate dates to reflect the effective date of the full implementation of the federal REAL ID Act.
