2019 Wisconsin Act 134 [2019 Assembly Bill 502]

Transferring Authority to Represent the Interests of the Public in CHIPS Proceedings

BACKGROUND

State law provides that a county may transfer authority to represent the public interest in a child in need of protection or services (CHIPS) proceeding to or from the district attorney. Under prior law, a county could only transfer this authority to or from the district attorney if the transfer was effective on **September 1 of an odd-numbered year** and the county notified the Department of Administration (DOA) of the transfer by January 1 of the same odd-numbered year.

2019 WISCONSIN ACT 134

2019 Wisconsin Act 134 eliminates the requirement that a county may only transfer authority to represent the public interest in a CHIPS proceeding to or from a district attorney if the transfer takes effect on September 1 of an odd-numbered year. Instead, the act provides that the county may transfer this authority to take effect on **any given day during any given year**, but only if the county notifies DOA of the change no later than January 1 of the calendar year in which the change takes effect.
