2009 Senate Bill 410 relates to designating and marking a portion of Interstate 43 in the City of Milwaukee as the “Jeannetta Simpson-Robinson Memorial Highway.”

Senate Amendment 1 to the bill ensures that no state funds will be used for this designation. Under the amendment:

1. Upon receipt of sufficient contributions from interested parties, including any county, city, village, or town, to cover the costs of erecting and maintaining markers along the route specified in the bill to clearly identify to motorists the designation of the route as the “Jeannetta Simpson-Robinson Memorial Highway,” the Department of Transportation must erect and maintain the markers.

2. No state funds, other than from the receipt of contributions under item 1, above, may be expended for the erection or maintenance of the markers.

Legislative History

At an executive session on February 5, 2010, the Senate Committee on Transportation, Tourism, Forestry, and Natural Resources voted to adopt Senate Amendment 1 to the bill (offered by Senator Coggs) on a vote of Ayes, 6; Noes, 0. The committee then voted passage of the bill, as amended, on a vote of Ayes, 5; Noes, 0.
