2015 ASSEMBLY BILL 448

2015 Assembly Bill 448 creates a trapping mentorship program which allows a mentored trapper to trap an animal, other than a bobcat, fisher, otter, or wolf, without obtaining a trapper education certificate if the mentored trapper is accompanied by a qualified mentor and the mentored trapper holds a valid trapping approval.

The bill also clarifies that if a trap is operated by more than one trapper, the trap must be tagged with the metal stamp of each trap operator.

ASSEMBLY SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT 1

Assembly Amendment 1 eliminates the requirement under the bill that a mentored trapper hold a trapping license.

BILL HISTORY

Assembly Substitute Amendment 1 was introduced by Representative Quinn. On November 17, 2015, the Assembly Committee on Natural Resources and Sporting Heritage recommended adoption of the amendment and passage of the bill, as amended, on votes of Ayes: 15; Noes: 0.
