2017 ASSEMBLY BILL 94

Assembly Bill 94 requires the Department of Corrections (DOC) to recommend revoking a person's extended supervision, parole, or probation if that person is charged with a crime.

ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 1

Assembly Amendment 1 requires DOC to recommend revoking a person's extended supervision, parole, or probation if that person is charged with a crime **before June 30, 2020**. The amendment also requires the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to submit a study concerning the costs involved in the revocation requirement to the Legislature by January 15, 2020.

ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 3

Assembly Amendment 3 allows DOC to revise its recommendation to revoke a person's extended supervision, parole, or probation if the charges are subsequently dismissed or if the person is found not guilty of the crime.

BILL HISTORY

Assembly Amendment 1 was introduced by Representative Schraa and Assembly Amendment 3 was introduced by Representative Goyke on November 6, 2017. On November 7, 2017, the Assembly Committee on Corrections voted to recommend adoption of Amendment 1 on a vote of Ayes, 8; Noes, 1; and to recommend adoption of Amendment 3 on a vote of Ayes, 5; Noes, 4. The committee then voted to recommend passage of Assembly Bill 94, as amended, on a vote of Ayes, 6; Noes, 3.
