



1995 ASSEMBLY BILL 566

September 25, 1995 - Introduced by Representatives OTTE, GROTHMAN, RYBA, F. LASEE, ZIEGELBAUER, GUNDERSON and ROBSON, cosponsored by Senators ROSENZWEIG and C. POTTER. Referred to Committee on Ways and Means.

1 **AN ACT to amend** 121.07 (6) (a) (intro.); and **to create** 121.91 (4) (d) of the
2 statutes; **relating to:** increasing a school district's revenue limit by the amount
3 necessary to comply with certain orders and excluding that amount from the
4 school district's shared cost.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law limits the increase in the total amount of revenue that a school district may receive from general school aids and property taxes in the 1993-94 to 1997-98 school years. In the 1993-94 school year, the maximum allowable increase per pupil was \$190 or the rate of inflation, whichever was greater. Beginning in the 1994-95 school year, the \$190 per pupil amount is adjusted each year by the rate of inflation. Several exceptions are provided. For example, if a school district increases the services that it provides by adding responsibility for providing a service transferred to it from another governmental unit, its revenue limit is increased by the cost of that service.

This bill provides that a school district's revenue limit is increased by the amount necessary to comply with an order of a court, a federal agency or a city, village, town or county to remedy any violation of law relating to health or safety. The bill also excludes from a school district's shared cost (costs that are aidable through the general aid formula) the amount described above.
