1995 ASSEMBLY BILL 608

October 10, 1995 – Introduced by Representatives Underheim, Owens, Goetsch, Hahn, Kelso, Wood, Silbaugh, Musser, Kaufert, Olsen, Gard, Ladwig, Ott and Vrakas, cosponsored by Senators Buettner, Ellis and Breske. Referred to Committee on Judiciary.

AN ACT to amend 69.20 (3) (d) of the statutes; relating to: disclosure of information on marriage documents to law enforcement officers performing investigations.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the state registrar or a local registrar may disclose information from a birth, death or divorce or annulment certificate or a marriage document, except certain information collected for statistical or medical purposes, to a federal, state or local agency if the information requested is for use in conducting the agency's official duties.

This bill requires the state registrar or a local registrar to disclose information from a marriage document, except for certain information collected for statistical or medical purposes, if the information is requested by a law enforcement officer who is performing an investigation.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- SECTION 1. 69.20 (3) (d) of the statutes is amended to read:
 69.20 (3) (d) The state or a local registrar may disclose information from the
 vital record of a specified registrant, except information under sub. (2) (a), to a federal
- agency, to any agency of the government of this state or to any agency of a county, city,

town or village if the agency requests the information for use in the conduct of its official duties. The state or local registrar shall disclose information from a marriage document of a specified registrant to a law enforcement officer, as defined in s. 51.01 (11), if the law enforcement officer requests the information for the performance of an investigation.
