1995 ASSEMBLY BILL 972

February 29, 1996 - Introduced by Representatives Hahn, Owens, Musser, Goetsch and Seratti. Referred to Committee on Education.

AN ACT to repeal 115.01 (10) (a) 1., 115.01 (10) (a) 2., 115.01 (10) (b), 121.004 (7) (c) 1. a., 121.004 (7) (c) 2. and 121.02 (1) (f) 1.; to renumber and amend 115.01 (10) (a) (intro.), 121.006 (2) (a) and 121.02 (1) (f) 2.; to consolidate, renumber and amend 121.004 (7) (c) 1. (intro.) and b.; to amend 119.71 (1), 120.12 (15), 121.004 (7) (a), 121.004 (7) (cm), 121.05 (1) (a) 8. and 121.23 (2) (intro.); and to create 121.004 (5m) and 121.006 (2) (a) 2. of the statutes; relating to: the number of school days required each school term.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, school is required to be held for at least 180 days during the school term (the time beginning with the first school day and ending with the last school day that the schools are in operation for the attendance of pupils in a school year). In addition, each school board must schedule at least 437 hours of direct pupil instruction in kindergarten, at least 1,050 hours of direct pupil instruction in grades 1 to 6 and at least 1,137 hours of direct pupil instruction in grades 7 to 12. This bill requires that school be held for these minimum required hours of instruction and eliminates the requirement that school be held at least 180 days.

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121.004 (7) (a) "Pupils enrolled" is the total number of pupils, as expressed by official enrollments, in all schools of the school district. A pupil shall be counted as the number obtained by dividing the total number of hours of instruction in which the pupil is enrolled during the school term by the minimum required hours of instruction, except as provided in pars. (b) to (d). If such total contains a fraction, it shall be expressed as the nearest whole number. The same method shall be used in computing the number of pupils enrolled for resident pupils, nonresident pupils or both.

SECTION 9. 121.004 (7) (c) 1. (intro.) and b. of the statutes are consolidated, renumbered 121.004 (7) (c) and amended to read:

121.004 (7) (c) A pupil enrolled in kindergarten may be counted only if the pupil attains the age permitted under s. 115.28 (8) or required under s. 118.14 for kindergarten admission. A kindergarten pupil shall be counted as one-half pupil except that: b. A a pupil enrolled in a 5-year-old kindergarten program requiring full-day attendance for less than 5 days a week for an entire school year attendance for more than 525 hours in a school term shall be counted as the result obtained by multiplying the number of hours in each day in which the pupil is enrolled by the total number of days for which the pupil is enrolled, and dividing the result by the product of the number of hours of attendance per day required of first grade pupils in the school district multiplied by 180 dividing the number of hours of direct pupil instruction scheduled for the pupil during the school term by 1,050.

Section 11. 121.004 (7) (c) 2. of the statutes is repealed.

Section 12. 121.004 (7) (cm) of the statutes is amended to read:

121.004 (7) (cm) A pupil enrolled in a 4-year-old kindergarten program that
provides the required number of hours of direct pupil instruction under s. 121.02 (1)
(f) 2. shall be counted as 0.6 pupil if the program annually provides at least 87.5 addi-
tional hours of outreach activities.
Section 13. 121.006 (2) (a) of the statutes is renumbered 121.006 (2) (a) (intro.)
and amended to read:
121.006 (2) (a) (intro.) Hold school for at least 180 days each year the minimum
required hours of instruction, less any days of the following:
1. Hours during which the department determines that school is not held or
educational standards are not maintained as the result of a strike by school district
employes, the days to be computed in accordance with s. 115.01 (10).
Section 14. 121.006 (2) (a) 2. of the statutes is created to read:
121.006 (2) (a) 2. Hours during which school is closed by order of a local health
officer, as defined in s. 250.01 (5).
Section 15. 121.02 (1) (f) 1. of the statutes is repealed.
Section 16. 121.02 (1) (f) 2. of the statutes is renumbered 121.02 (1) (f) and
amended to read:
121.02 (1) (f) Annually, schedule at least 437 hours of direct pupil instruction
in kindergarten, at least 1,050 hours of direct pupil instruction in grades 1 to 6 and
at least 1,137 hours of direct pupil instruction in grades 7 to 12. Scheduled hours
under this subdivision paragraph include recess and time for pupils to transfer be-
tween classes but do not include the lunch period. A school board operating a 4-year-
old kindergarten program may use up to 87.5 of the scheduled hours for outreach ac-
tivities.
Section 17. 121.05 (1) (a) 8. of the statutes is amended to read:

121.05 (1) (a) 8. Pupils enrolled in a residential school operated by the state
under subch. III of ch. 115 for whom the school district is paying tuition under s.
115.53 (2) determined by multiplying the total number of periods in each day in
which the pupils are enrolled in the local public school by the total number of days
for which the pupils are enrolled in the local public school and dividing the product
by $1,080$ the number of hours of direct pupil instruction scheduled for pupils enrolled
in the school district in the same grade as the pupil who is enrolled in the residential
school.
Section 18. 121.23 (2) (intro.) of the statutes, as affected by 1995 Wisconsin
Act 27, is amended to read:
121.23 (2) (intro.) If a school district holds less than 180 days of school the mini-
mum required hours of instruction as the result of a strike by school district em-
ployes, for the purposes of computing general aid, the department shall compute the
school district's primary and secondary ceiling costs per member in accordance with
the procedure specified in pars. (a) to (e). In making the calculation, the department
