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## **1995 SENATE BILL 266**

June 28, 1995 - Introduced by Senators Zien, Rude, Ellis, Leean, Buettner, Farrow, Drzewiecki, A. Lasee, Schultz, Fitzgerald, Panzer, Rosenzweig, Darling, Huelsman, Petak and Weeden, cosponsored by Representative Hahn. Referred to Committee on Human Resources, Labor, Tourism, Veterans and Military Affairs.

AN ACT relating to: the Northern Great Lakes Regional Visitor Center.

## Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under the bill, if the federal government approves federal funding for a Northern Great Lakes Regional Visitor Center, the building commission may commence planning activities with respect to the center and shall submit proposed legislation to the joint committee on finance. The bill requires that this proposed legislation amend the state building program to enumerate the Northern Great Lakes Regional Visitor Center as a state building project, to be funded with 4,100,000 in general fund supported borrowing and with \$4,100,000 in federal funding. The bill also requires this proposed legislation to authorize the state to contract up to \$4,100,000 in public debt for the center.

## The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

## **SECTION 1. Nonstatutory provisions.**

(1) NORTHERN GREAT LAKES REGIONAL VISITOR CENTER. If the federal government approves federal funding for a Northern Great Lakes Regional Visitor Center, the building commission may begin planning activities with respect to the center and shall submit to the cochairpersons of the joint committee on finance, for introduction to the legislature, proposed legislation to do all of the following:

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(a) Amend the state building program to enumerate the Northern Great Lakes
Regional Visitor Center as a state building project, to be funded with $\$4,100,000$ in
general fund supported borrowing and \$4,100,000 in federal funding.
(b) Provide authorization for the state to contract up to \$4,100,000 in public
debt for the center.
