February 28, 1996 – Introduced by Senators Rude and Clausing, cosponsored by Representatives Harsdorf, Dueholm and Johnsrud. Referred to Committee on Environment and Energy.

- AN ACT *to create* 30.725 of the statutes; **relating to:** placing and using boats and boating equipment, and placing boat trailers, with zebra mussels attached in the Lower St. Croix River.

Under this bill, a person may not have a boat, boat trailer or boating equipment in the Lower St. Croix River if the person has reason to believe that the boat, equipment or trailer has zebra mussels attached. The bill also authorizes law enforcement officers, including conservation wardens, to require that a person remove zebra mussels from a boat, boat trailer or boating equipment before placing the boat, trailer or equipment in the water or to require that a person remove a boat, trailer or equipment from the water.
