

1995 SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 14

March 2, 1995 – Introduced by Senators ZIEN, RUDE, MOEN, CLAUSING, COWLES, SCHULTZ, BRESKE, DARLING, FITZGERALD, ROSENZWEIG, BUETTNER, DRZEWIECKI and A. LASEE, cosponsored by Representatives MUSSER, BOYLE, ZUKOWSKI, GROBSCHMIDT, ALBERS, GUNDERSON, JOHNSRUD, FREESE, DOBYNS, GOETSCH, HOVEN, WIRCH, LORGE, R. POTTER, KREIBICH, NASS, OWENS, KREUSER, BRANDEMUEHL, SERATTI, HASENOHRL, HAHN, RYBA, SKINDRUD, OURADA, UNDERHEIM, OTT, SILBAUGH, GROTHMAN, TURNER, VANDER LOOP and BALDUS, by request of Wisconsin State Council, Vietnam Veterans of America. 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3 Whereas, numerous men and women who served in the Middle East with the

commission on the health care concerns of Persian Gulf War veterans.

- 4 U.S. armed forces during the Persian Gulf War, many of whom are from Wisconsin,
- 5 are now suffering from a wide range of physical and psychological maladies, the exact
- 6 causes of which are unknown at this time; and
- Whereas, historically the federal government has been hesitant to accept
 responsibility for many medical conditions suffered by veterans that subsequently
 have been directly linked to their military service, including those incurred by World
 War II, Korean War and Cold War radiation veterans, World War I mustard gas
 exposure veterans, and Vietnam War Agent Orange veterans; and
- Whereas, there is presently insufficient independent medical research being
 conducted with respect to the health care concerns of Persian Gulf War veterans;
 now, therefore, be it
- 15 **Resolved by the senate, the Assembly concurring, That:** the President and 16 Congress are urged to expeditiously create a temporary independent federal 17 commission on the health care concerns of Persian Gulf War veterans to ensure the

prompt resolution of this issue as well as to ensure appropriate treatment and
 compensation of these veterans without any further unnecessary delay; and, be it
 further

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Resolved, That: the senate chief clerk shall forward a copy of this joint
resolution to the President of the United States, each member of the Wisconsin
congressional delegation and the members of the U.S. senate and house veterans
affairs committees.
