- 3 Whereas, for decades the University of Wisconsin–Madison (UW–Madison) has
- 4 been ranked among the top universities in the United States, with undergraduate
- 5 and graduate students alike benefiting from its dedication to excellence in teaching,
- 6 research and public service; and
- 7 Whereas, UW-Madison's tradition of excellence continues to be recognized
- 8 with an announcement in September by the prestigious National Research Council
- 9 (NRC) that 16 doctoral programs at UW–Madison rank among the nation's top 10 in
- 10 their respective fields; and
- 11 Whereas, an additional 19 UW-Madison doctoral programs rank among the 25
- 12 best in the nation, as reported in a comprehensive analysis conducted by the NRC
- 13 every 10 years; and

14 Whereas, overall, the quality of UW-Madison's doctoral programs ranks 15 among the top 10 of 274 doctorate-granting public and private universities included 16 in the nationwide survey; and 1995 – 1996 Legislature

Whereas, the NRC survey illustrates UW-Madison's excellence across a wide
 variety of disciplines, from foreign languages to biochemistry, and from geography
 to computer science and engineering; and
