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**relating to:** the regulation of occupational therapists and occupational therapy assistants, creating an occupational therapists affiliated credentialing board, requiring the exercise of rule–making authority and providing a penalty.

#### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, with certain exceptions, a person must be certified by the medical examining board (examining board) in the department of regulation and licensing (DORL) in order to practice as an occupational therapist or occupational therapy assistant or to designate himself or herself as an occupational therapy assistant.

This bill creates a five-member occupational therapists affiliated credentialing board (affiliated credentialing board) in DORL consisting of two occupational therapists, one occupational therapy assistant and two public members, and transfers to the affiliated credentialing board all authority that the examining board has under current law relating to the regulation of occupational therapists and occupational therapy assistants. In addition, the bill requires the affiliated credentialing board to license, rather than certify, persons to practice as occupational therapists or occupational therapy assistants. The bill also does all of the following:

- 1. To qualify for certification under current law, a person must meet educational and other requirements, including a) being certified as either an occupational therapist or an occupational therapy assistant by the American occupational therapy certification board; and b) being found qualified by three-fourths of the members of the examining board. The bill retains the educational requirements that a person must satisfy for a license, but requires a person to be certified as an occupational therapist or occupational therapy assistant by the National Board for Certification in Occupational Therapy, rather than by the American occupational therapy certification board. In addition, the bill does not require three-fourths of the affiliated credentialing board to find that an applicant is qualified.
- 2. Under current law, a health care practitioner licensed or certified by the examining board, including an occupational therapist or occupational therapy assistant, must register with the examining board every two years, meet continuing education requirements, pay a license or certificate renewal fee and display a certificate of registration in his or her office at all times. Registration with the examining board is deemed to satisfy any statutory requirement to renew a license or certificate. The bill eliminates these requirements. Instead, an occupational therapist or occupational therapy assistant must renew his or her license every two years by submitting a renewal form to DORL, accompanied by a renewal fee and a statement attesting that the occupational therapist or occupational therapy assistant has complied with continuing education requirements promulgated by rule by the affiliated credentialing board.

- (b) Subject to ss. 111.321, 111.322 and 111.335, been convicted of an offense the circumstances of which substantially relate to the practice of occupational therapy or assisting in the practice of occupational therapy.
  - (c) Advertised in a manner that is false, deceptive or misleading.
  - (d) Advertised, practiced or attempted to practice under another's name.

- (e) Subject to ss. 111.321, 111.322 and 111.34, practiced occupational therapy or assisted in the practice of occupational therapy while his or her ability to practice was impaired by alcohol or other drugs.
- (f) Engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct in violation of the code of ethics established in the rules promulgated under s. 448.965 (1) (c).
- (g) Engaged in conduct while practicing occupational therapy or assisting in the practice of occupational therapy that evidences a lack of knowledge or ability to apply professional principles or skills.
  - (h) Violated this subchapter or any rule promulgated under this subchapter.
- 448.969 Injunctive relief. If the affiliated credentialing board has reason to believe that any person is violating this subchapter or any rule promulgated under this subchapter, the affiliated credentialing board, the department, the attorney general or the district attorney of the proper county may investigate and may, in addition to any other remedies, bring an action in the name and on behalf of this state to enjoin the person from the violation.
- **448.970 Penalties; appeal. (1)** A person who violates any provision of this subchapter may be fined not more than \$10,000 or imprisoned for not more than 9 months or both.
- (2) Any person aggrieved by any action taken under this subchapter by the affiliated credentialing board, its officers or its agents may apply for judicial review as provided in ch. 227, and shall file notice of such appeal with the secretary of the affiliated credentialling board within 30 days. No court of this state may enter an ex parte stay of any action taken by the affiliated credentialing board under this subchapter.

#### **SECTION 58. Nonstatutory provisions.**

- (1) Definitions. In this Section:
- (a) "Affiliated credentialing board" means the occupational therapists affiliated credentialing board.
  - (b) "Examining board" means the medical examining board.
  - (c) "Examining council" means the occupational therapy examining council.
- (2) Initial appointments. Notwithstanding the length of the terms specified in section 15.406 (5) (intro.) of the statutes, as created by this act, the initial members of the affiliated credentialing board shall be appointed by the first day of the 4th month beginning after the effective date of this subsection for the following terms:
- (a) One occupational therapist and one public member, for terms expiring on July 1, 2001.
  - (b) One occupational therapist assistant, for a term expiring on July 1, 2002.
  - (c) One occupational therapist, for a term expiring on July 1, 2003.
  - (d) One public member, for a term expiring on July 1, 2003.
- (3) Transfer of authority and records from examining board; transitional provisions. During the period beginning on the effective date of this subsection and ending on the first day of the 7th month beginning after the effective date of this subsection, the examining board and examining council shall cooperate with the affiliated credentialing board, as created by this act, in providing orderly and

efficient transfers under this subsection. On the first day of the 7th month beginning after the effective date of this subsection, all of the following apply:

- (a) The assets and liabilities of the examining board and the examining council pertaining to the regulation of occupational therapists and occupational therapy assistants shall become the assets and liabilities of the affiliated credentialing board.
- (b) All tangible personal property, including records, of the examining board and examining council pertaining to the regulation of occupational therapists and occupational therapy assistants is transferred to the affiliated credentialing board.
- (c) All rules pertaining to the regulation of occupational therapists and occupational therapy assistants that have been promulgated by the examining board and that are in effect shall become rules of the affiliated credentialing board and shall remain in effect until their specified expiration dates or until amended or repealed by the affiliated credentialing board. All orders pertaining to the regulation of occupational therapists and occupational therapy assistants that have been issued by the examining board and that are in effect shall become orders of the affiliated credentialing board and shall remain in effect until their specified expiration dates or until modified or rescinded by the affiliated credentialing board.
- (d) Any matter relating to the regulation of occupational therapists and occupational therapy assistants that is pending with the examining board is transferred to the affiliated credentialing board, and all materials submitted to or actions taken by the examining board with respect to the pending matter are considered to have been submitted to or taken by the affiliated credentialing board.
- (e) Notwithstanding section 448.963 (2) of the statutes, as created by this act, any person who, on the day before the first day of the 7th month beginning after the effective date of this paragraph, was certified as an occupational therapist by the

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examining board under subchapter II of chapter 448 of the statutes is considered to
be licensed as an occupational therapist by the affiliated credentialing board under
subchapter VII of chapter 448 of the statutes, as created by this act, without meeting
any of the requirements of section 448.963 (2) of the statutes, as created by this act.
(f) Notwithstanding section 448,963 (3) of the statutes, as created by this act.

(f) Notwithstanding section 448.963 (3) of the statutes, as created by this act, any person who, on the day before the first day of the 7th month beginning after the effective date of this paragraph, was certified as an occupational therapy assistant by the examining board under subchapter II of chapter 448 of the statutes is considered to be licensed as an occupational therapy assistant by the affiliated credentialing board under subchapter VII of chapter 448 of the statutes, as created by this act, without meeting any of the requirements of section 448.963 (3) of the statutes, as created by this act.

**SECTION 59. Effective dates.** This act takes effect on the first day of the 7th month after publication, except as follows:

(1) The treatment of sections  $15.08 \, (1m) \, (b)$ ,  $15.085 \, (1m) \, (b)$  and  $15.406 \, (5)$  of the statutes and Section 58 of this act take effect on the day after publication.
