# **1999 ASSEMBLY BILL 768**

February 17, 2000 – Introduced by Representatives SCHOOFF, MEYERHOFER, SINICKI, LADWIG, PLALE, KEDZIE, RICHARDS, BOCK, BLACK, MILLER, POCAN, BOYLE, LA FAVE, KREUSER, PLOUFF, TURNER, SYKORA, GRONEMUS, BERCEAU, HASENOHRL, MUSSER and RYBA, cosponsored by Senators GROBSCHMIDT, ROBSON, ROSENZWEIG, SHIBILSKI, BAUMGART, ERPENBACH, MOEN, PLACHE and RISSER. Referred to Committee on Education.

1	AN ACT to renumber and amend 115.93; to amend 115.88 (1m) (a), 115.88 (1m)
2	(am), 115.88 (2), 115.88 (2m), 115.88 (3), 115.88 (6), 115.88 (8) and 118.255 (4);
3	<i>to repeal and recreate</i> 115.882; and <i>to create</i> 115.88 (1m) (b) and 115.93 (3)
4	of the statutes; relating to: state aid for special education and school age
5	parents programs.

#### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law requires that aidable costs incurred for special education by school districts, cooperative educational service agencies, county children with disabilities education boards and certain charter schools be fully reimbursed by the state, subject to the availability of funds.

This bill provides for most aidable costs for special education to be reimbursed by the state at the rate of 63%. The salaries of school psychologists and social workers are reimbursed at 51% and the costs of special education for children in hospital and convalescent homes are fully reimbursed. The bill provides that if insufficient funds are appropriated, payments are prorated.

# The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

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**SECTION 1.** 115.88 (1m) (a) of the statutes, as affected by 1999 Wisconsin Act 1 2 9, is amended to read:

3 115.88 (1m) (a) If, upon receipt of the plan under s. 115.77 (4), the state 4 superintendent is satisfied that the special education program has been maintained 5 during the preceding school year in accordance with law, the state superintendent 6 shall certify to the department of administration in favor of each county, cooperative 7 educational service agency and school district maintaining such special education 8 program a sum equal to <u>63% of</u> the amount expended by the county, agency and 9 school district during the preceding year for salaries of personnel enumerated in sub. 10 (1), including the salary portion of any authorized contract for physical or 11 occupational therapy services, except as provided in par. (b), and other expenses 12approved by the state superintendent as costs eligible for reimbursement. The 13department of administration shall pay such amounts to the county, agency and 14school district from the appropriation under s. 20.255 (2) (b).

SECTION 2. 115.88 (1m) (am) of the statutes, as created by 1999 Wisconsin Act 1516 9. is amended to read:

17115.88 (1m) (am) If the operator of a charter school established under s. 118.40 18 (2r) operates a special education program and the state superintendent is satisfied 19 that the operator of the charter school is complying with 20 USC 1400 to 14910, the 20state superintendent shall certify to the department of administration in favor of the 21operator of the charter school a sum equal to <u>63% of</u> the amount that the operator 22of the charter school expended during the previous school year for salaries of 23full-time or part-time licensed teachers, licensed coordinators of special education,  $\mathbf{24}$ licensed school social workers, licensed school psychologists, paraprofessionals, licensed consulting teachers to work with any teacher of regular education programs 25

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who has a child with a disability in a class and any other personnel, <u>except as</u>
<u>provided under par. (b)</u>, as determined by the state superintendent. Certified costs
under this paragraph are eligible for reimbursement The department of
administration shall pay such amounts to the operator of the charter school from the
appropriation under s. 20.255 (2) (b). The state superintendent may audit costs
under this paragraph and adjust reimbursement to cover only actual, eligible costs.
SECTION 3. 115.88 (1m) (b) of the statutes is created to read:

8 115.88 (1m) (b) Salaries of licensed school psychologists and licensed school 9 social workers shall be reimbursed at 51% without regard to whether they are 10 employed in a program for children with disabilities. The school district, county 11 children with disabilities education board or cooperative educational service agency 12 shall include in the plan under s. 115.77 (4) any information required by the state 13 superintendent relating to use of a school psychologist or school social worker.

SECTION 4. 115.88 (2) of the statutes, as affected by 1999 Wisconsin Act 9, is
amended to read:

115.88 (2) TRANSPORTATION AID. If upon receipt of the plan under s. 115.77 (4) 16 17the state superintendent is satisfied that the transportation of children with 18 disabilities has been maintained during the preceding year in accordance with the 19 law, the state superintendent shall certify to the department of administration in 20 favor of each county, cooperative educational service agency or school district 21transporting such pupils an amount equal to <u>63% of</u> the amount expended for such 22 transportation as costs eligible for reimbursement from the appropriations under s. 2320.255 (2) (b) and (br). Pupils for whom aid is paid under this subsection shall not 24be eligible for aid under s. 121.58 (2) or (4). The department of administration shall pay such amounts to the county, agency or school district from the appropriations 25

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<u>under s. 20.255 (2) (b) and (br).</u> This subsection applies to any child with a disability
who requires special assistance in transportation, including any such child
attending regular classes who requires special or additional transportation. This
subsection does not apply to any child with a disability attending regular or special
classes who does not require any special or additional transportation.

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**SECTION 5.** 115.88 (2m) of the statutes, as created by 1999 Wisconsin Act 9, is amended to read:

8 115.88 (2m) OTHER TRANSPORTATION AID. If the operator of a charter school 9 established under s. 118.40 (2r) transports children with disabilities and the state 10 superintendent is satisfied that the operator of the charter school is complying with 11 20 USC 1400 to 14910, the state superintendent shall certify to the department of 12administration in favor of the operator of the charter school a sum equal to 63% of 13the amount that the operator of the charter school expended during the previous 14school year for transportation under this subsection as costs eligible for 15reimbursement. The department of administration shall pay such costs from the appropriations appropriation under s. 20.255 (2) (b). The state superintendent may 16 17audit costs under this subsection and adjust reimbursement to cover only actual, 18 eligible costs.

SECTION 6. 115.88 (3) of the statutes, as affected by 1999 Wisconsin Act 9, is
amended to read:

115.88 (3) BOARD AND LODGING AID. There shall be paid the amount expended
for board and lodging and transportation between the boarding home and the special
education program of nonresident children enrolled under s. 115.82 (1) in the special
education program. The department shall certify the full amount to the department
of administration in favor of each which shall pay such amount from the

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1	appropriation under s. 20.255 (2) (b) to the school district, cooperative educational
2	service agency, county children with disabilities education board, state agency of
3	another state or private, nonsectarian special education service which operates the
4	special education program while providing board, lodging and transportation <del>an</del>
5	amount equal to the amount expended for such board and lodging and transportation
6	as costs eligible for reimbursement from the appropriation under s. 20.255 (2) (b).
7	SECTION 7. 115.88 (6) of the statutes, as affected by 1999 Wisconsin Act 9, is
8	amended to read:
9	115.88 (6) Aid for instruction outside of district. The department shall
10	certify to the department of administration, in favor of each school district, an
11	amount equal to the amount expended for salaries <u>From the appropriation under s.</u>
12	20.255 (2) (b) there shall be paid the full cost of salary and travel expenses, as in
13	<u>amounts</u> determined in advance by the state superintendent, <u>to school districts</u> for
14	providing special education outside the school district of employment <del>, as eligible for</del>
15	reimbursement from the appropriation under s. 20.255 (2) (b).
16	SECTION 8. 115.88 (8) of the statutes, as affected by 1999 Wisconsin Act 9, is
17	amended to read:
18	115.88 (8) ENROLLMENT OUT OF STATE. If a child with a disability is enrolled in
19	a public special education program located in another state and the state
20	superintendent is satisfied that the program in which the child is enrolled complies

superintendent is satisfied that the program in which the child is enrolled complies with this subchapter, the state superintendent shall certify to the department of administration in favor of the school district in which the child resides or the school district attended by the child under s. 118.51 a sum equal to the percentage of the approved costs under subs. (1) and (2) of the amount expended by the school district during the preceding year for the additional costs associated with the child's special

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1	education program <del>as costs eligible for reimbursement. The department of</del>
2	administration shall pay the amount to the school district from the appropriation
3	under s. 20.255 (2) (b).

6	<b>115.882 Proration of state aid.</b> If the sum of the appropriations under s.
7	20.255 (2) (b) and (br) in any one year is insufficient to pay the full amount of aid
8	under ss. 115.88 and 118.255, funds in the appropriations shall be used first for the
9	purpose of s. 115.88 (4) and any remaining funds shall be prorated among the
10	counties, school districts, operators of charter schools established under s. 118.40 (2r)
11	and cooperative educational service agencies entitled thereto.
12	SECTION 10. 115.93 of the statutes, as affected by 1999 Wisconsin Act 9, is
13	renumbered 115.93 (1) and amended to read:
14	115.93 <b>State aid. (1)</b> If <u>Except as provided under sub. (3), if</u> upon receipt of
15	the reports under s. 115.92 (2) the state superintendent is satisfied that the school
16	age parents program has been maintained during the preceding school year in
17	accordance with the rules under s. $115.92$ (3), the state superintendent shall certify
18	to the department of administration in favor of each school district maintaining the
19	program a sum equal to <u>63% of</u> the amount expended by the school district during
20	the preceding school year for salaries of teachers and instructional aides, special
21	transportation and other expenses approved by the state superintendent as costs
22	eligible for reimbursement. The department of administration shall pay such
23	amounts to the school district from the appropriation under s. $20.255$ (2) (b).
24	<b>SECTION 11.</b> 115.93 (3) of the statutes is created to read:

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1	115.93 (3) Subject to s. 115.882, if the appropriation under s. 20.255 (2) (b) in
2	any year is insufficient to pay the full amount of aid under sub. (1), state aid
3	payments shall be prorated among the entitled school districts.
4	<b>SECTION 12.</b> 118.255 (4) of the statutes, as affected by 1999 Wisconsin Act 9,
5	is amended to read:
6	118.255 (4) If the state superintendent is satisfied that the health treatment
7	services program has been maintained during the preceding school year in
8	accordance with law, the state superintendent shall certify to the department of
9	administration in favor of each school board, cooperative educational service agency
10	and county children with disabilities education board maintaining such health
11	treatment services, an amount equal to $\underline{63\%}$ of the amount expended for items listed
12	in s. 115.88 (1m) by the school board, cooperative educational service agency and
13	county children with disabilities education board during the preceding year for these
14	health treatment services as costs eligible for reimbursement from the appropriation
15	under s. 20.255 (2) (b). The department of administration, upon such certification
16	shall distribute the amounts to the appropriate school board, cooperative
17	educational service agency and county children with disabilities education board.
18	SECTION 13. Initial applicability.
19	(1) This act first applies to state aid paid in the 2000–01 school year.
