1	<b>Relating to:</b> requesting Congress to meet its fiscal responsibility for the education
2	of children with disabilities.
3	Whereas, the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act mandates
4	that children with disabilities, ages 3 through 21, receive a free appropriate public
5	education designed to meet their individual needs; and
6	Whereas, the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act establishes a
7	commitment to fund $40\%$ of the cost of educating children with disabilities; and
8	Whereas, the federal government currently meets only 10% of the cost of
9	educating children with disabilities in Wisconsin; and
10	Whereas, the number of medically fragile children and those with special needs
11	is growing faster than the general K-12 enrollment; and
12	Whereas, Wisconsin school districts are increasingly forced to transfer dollars
13	from regular education in order to fund the mandated special education services;

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Resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring, That the members of the Wisconsin legislature request Congress to appropriate sufficient funds to meet its commitment of 40% support for the education of children with disabilities; and, be it further

Resolved, That the senate chief clerk shall provide a copy of this joint resolution to all of the members of this state's congressional delegation.
