2001 SENATE BILL 261

October 2, 2001 – Introduced by Senators BAUMGART, PLACHE, BURKE, RISSER, MOEN and GROBSCHMIDT, cosponsored by Representatives Gunderson, Pocan, Ott, SINICKI, BOYLE, STASKUNAS, PLOUFF, M. LEHMAN, J. LEHMAN, LA FAVE, MEYERHOFER, COGGS, MILLER, RYBA, BIES and WASSERMAN. Referred to Committee on Education.

1 AN ACT to create 121.91 (4) (n) of the statutes; relating to: increasing a school

district's revenue limit for heating costs.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law generally limits the increase in the total amount of revenue per pupil that a school district may receive from general school aids and property taxes in a school year to the amount of revenue increase allowed per pupil in the previous school year increased by the percentage change in the consumer price index. Several exceptions are provided. For example, if a school district increases the services that it provides by adding responsibility for providing a service transferred to it from another governmental unit, its revenue limit is increased by the cost of that service.

This bill provides that a school district's revenue limit is increased by an amount equal to the increased cost of heating the school district's buildings in the current school year as compared to the previous school year.
