2	Whereas, Jerome Nicholas "Cork" Meyer was born on November 3, 1918, in
3	Waunakee, Wisconsin, and passed away on March 30, 2001; and
4	Whereas, he graduated from St. John's School in 1932 and from Waunakee
5	High School in 1936; and
6	Whereas, in 1942, he attended Whitewater State University and studied Army
7	Administration at the Mississippi Southern College; and
8	Whereas, he served in the United States Army from November 1941 to October
9	1945, including 20 months overseas in North Africa, Italy, France, and Germany; and
10	Whereas, after being honorably discharged, Jerome attended Madison
11	Business College and the University of Wisconsin-Madison; and
12	Whereas, on February 12, 1944, he married Muriel Riley at St. Ann's Chapel
13	in Ipswich, Massachusetts; and

Relating to: the life and public service of Jerome Meyer.

Whereas, Jerome was a lifelong member of St. John's Catholic Church and an active member of St. John's Knights of Columbus and the Holy Trinity Tri-County Fourth Degree Council; and

Whereas, he was a member of the Waunakee Village Board for 10 years and a longtime Assistant Chief Clerk of the Wisconsin State Senate, retiring in 1982; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring, That the members of the Wisconsin legislature commend the life of Jerome Meyer as a shinning example of public service in the best tradition of Wisconsin and mourn the passing of a friend and associate; and, be it further
