generosity in working to improve the lives of others through various charitable
organizations, including the Make-A-Wish Foundation, which seeks to improve the
lives of terminally ill children; and
Whereas, Bob Uecker is a native of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, and has
continuously given back to the community through his charity events, such as
Uecker's Great Lakes Invitational fishing tournament, Mr. Baseball's Brats Benefit,
and the Uecker Ride for the arts; and
Whereas, Bob Uecker was inducted into the Radio Hall of Fame on November
3, 2001, and was the first former player turned broadcaster to achieve this feat; now,
