13	Whereas, Officer Meyer made the ultimate sacrifice for the people of
14	Winnebago County by giving his life for their protection; and

Whereas, Officer Meyer will always be remembered for being a strong and compassionate man, a loving and faithful husband, a dedicated and passionate father, a caring and devoted son, a thoughtful and considerate grandson, a dependable and supportive brother, a fun-loving and loyal friend, and always a remarkable deputy; now, therefore, be it
