2003 SENATE RESOLUTION 18

September 29, 2003 – Introduced by Senators Leibham, Kedzie, Schultz, Roessler, Stepp, Kanavas, Welch, S. Fitzgerald and Zien. Referred to Committee on Senate Organization.

| 3 | Whereas, the emergence of the Internet as a means of communication has |
| 4 | profoundly influenced our society and will pave the way for the global marketplace; |
| 5 | and |
| 6 | Whereas, Wisconsin is one of only 8 states that imposes a sales tax on Internet |
| 7 | access, thereby putting Wisconsin companies that conduct business over the Internet |
| 8 | at a competitive disadvantage; and |
| 9 | Whereas, the U.S. department of commerce has estimated that wealthy |
| 10 | Americans are 20 times more likely to have Internet access, while Hispanics and |
| 11 | African Americans are far less likely to have Internet access; and |
| 12 | Whereas, there is a growing "digital divide" between those citizens able to |
| 13 | access the technology of the new economy and those who cannot; and |
| 14 | Whereas, increased access to the Internet will create jobs and contribute to |
| 15 | economic development; and |

| 1 | Whereas, taxing access to the Internet will make access to the Internet less |

| 2 | affordable and therefore less available; and |
| 3 | Whereas, taxing Internet access contributes to this condition and unfairly |
| 4 | burdens citizens who are least able to afford Internet access; and |
| 5 | Whereas, the Wisconsin legislature has previously voted to repeal the state's |
| 6 | sales tax on Internet access thus demonstrating its commitment to making sure that |
| 7 | Wisconsin is on the leading edge of this new technology and providing incentives for |
| 8 | even more access and creative use of the Internet; and |
| 9 | Whereas, H.R. 49, which is entitled the Internet Tax Nondiscrimination Act of |
| 10 | 2003, has been introduced in the United States house of representatives and will |
| 11 | permanently prohibit any state from imposing a tax on access to the Internet; now, |
| 12 | therefore, be it |
| 13 | Resolved by the senate, That the members of the Wisconsin senate |
| 14 | memorialize Congress to pass legislation that will immediately and permanently |
| 15 | prohibit any state from imposing a tax on access to the Internet; and, be it further |
| 16 | <i>Resolved, That</i> the senate chief clerk shall provide a copy of this resolution to |
| 17 | the governor, to each member of the Wisconsin congressional delegation, to the |
| 18 | president and vice president of the United States, to each member of the president's |
| 19 | cabinet, and to the secretary of the U.S. senate and clerk of the U.S. house of |
| 20 | representatives. |
