## 2005 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 108

July 12, 2006 – Introduced by Representative M. WILLIAMS, cosponsored by Senator Decker. Referred to Committee on Senate Organization.

**Relating to:** the life and service of Staff Sergeant Nathan Vacho of the United States 1 2 Army Reserve, who lost his life during Operation Iraqi Freedom. 3 Whereas, on May 5, 2006, Staff Sergeant Nathan Vacho, of Ladysmith, 4 Wisconsin, a member of the United States Army Reserve assigned to the 489th Civil 5 Affairs Battalion, Knoxville, Tennessee, and attached to Company B, 490th Cavalry 6 Squadron, 2nd Brigade Combat Team, 4th Infantry Division, United States Army, 7 died as a result of wounds received when an improvised explosive device near Al 8 Hillah, Iraq, struck his vehicle during combat operations in Iraq; and 9 Whereas, Nathan J. Vacho was born on April 4, 1977, in Chippewa Falls, 10 Wisconsin, was a 1995 graduate of Ladysmith High School, was a 4-year letter winner in football and wrestling, and was a member of the school newspaper staff; 11 12 and 13 Whereas, Staff Sergeant Nathan Vacho lived his dream of becoming a soldier just like his dad, John Vacho, grandfather, Tony Vacho, and great uncles, Bill Vacho, 14

Paul Vacho, Emil Vacho, and Milan Vacho; and

Whereas, Staff Sergeant Nathan Vacho began his Army career March 24, 1998. 1 2 when he enlisted into the Army Reserves as a military firefighter, with later training 3 as a health care specialist; and Whereas, Staff Sergeant Nathan Vacho's military training included Basic 4 5 Combat Training, Firefighter Course, Practical Nurse Course, and the Emergency 6 Medical Technician Refresher Course; and 7 Whereas, Staff Sergeant Nathan Vacho's military awards and decorations 8 include the Bronze Star Medal, the Purple Heart, the Meritorious Service Medal, the 9 Good Conduct Medal, the Reserve Components Achievement Medal, the National Defense Service Medal, the Iraq Campaign Medal, the Global War on Terrorism 10 11 Service Medal, the Armed Forces Reserve Medal with Mobilization Device, the Army Service Ribbon, and the Overseas Service Ribbon; and 12Whereas, Staff Sergeant Vacho provided faithful and honorable service to the 13 14 people of the United States as generations of his family had done before him; and 15 Whereas, Staff Sergeant Nathan Vacho was laid to rest on Tuesday, May 16, 2006; and 16 Whereas, the people of Wisconsin and the American people mourn the death of 17 18 Staff Sergeant Nathan Vacho; now, therefore, be it 19 **Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That** the legislature of 20 the state of Wisconsin commemorates the remarkable life of Staff Sergeant Nathan 21Vacho and extends its deepest sympathies to his family, friends, and colleagues; and, be it further 22 23 **Resolved, That** the assembly chief clerk shall transmit a copy of this joint

resolution to Staff Sergeant Nathan Vacho's parents, John and Carol, his daughters,
