4	Whereas, William Proxmire received a B.A. degree from Yale University in
5	1938, an M.B.A. degree in 1940, and an M.P.A. degree in 1948 from Harvard
6	University; and
7	Whereas, William Proxmire served his nation during World War II in military
8	intelligence from 1941 to 1946; and
9	Whereas, William Proxmire was elected to the Wisconsin assembly in 1950 and
10	served in the 1951 session; and
11	Whereas, William Proxmire represented the state of Wisconsin in the U.S.
12	senate from 1957 to 1989; and
13	Whereas, William Proxmire personally greeted many of his Wisconsin

1	Whereas, William Proxmire became a familiar face on the television network
2	Sunday news shows; and
3	Whereas, William Proxmire's 32 years of service in the U.S. senate, where he
4	cast more than 10,000 roll call votes, was the longest in Wisconsin's history; and
5	Whereas, while serving in the U.S. senate, one of his proudest achievements
6	was the senate's approval of an international genocide treaty in 1986; and
7	Whereas, William Proxmire was an advocate of physical fitness who frequently
8	jogged to his capitol office long before such activity became commonplace; and
9	Whereas, William Proxmire was responsible for creating the "Golden Fleece"
10	awards which began in 1975 to point out what he thought were frivolous
11	expenditures, and which became a Washington tradition; and
12	Whereas, William Proxmire leaves behind an unparalleled legacy as a defender
13	of the American taxpayer and one of the hardest working senators in U.S. history;
14	now, therefore, be it

16	Wisconsin legislature commend the devoted public service of William Proxmire to the
17	people of Wisconsin, express their sorrow at his death, and extend their condolences
