Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, when the Department of Transportation (DOT) or a municipality acquires land, or interests or rights in land, for a public project, it files a plat describing the acquired land in the office of the register of deeds where the land is located. The plat depicts the order authorizing the acquisition of the land and may be referred to in legal documents to describe the land or interests in the land. This bill makes changes to the way plats are filed and recorded.

Under the bill, DOT or a municipality may file a plat describing land that is either acquired or disposed of for a project, and a plat may consist of a single sheet or a detail and a title sheet that describes the limits of the project involving the land, a location map, and identification of plat symbols and abbreviations.

The bill clarifies that an affidavit of correction may be filed to correct scrivener errors but may not be used to reconfigure land parcels or rights or interests that are

required for a project. The bill also allows a plat to be used to delineate a right-of-way, and allows for more flexibility in the materials used for a plat and the size of an acceptable plat.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

18	after the plat is signed under sub. (4) (a) 4. The register of deeds shall file or record
