

2005 SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 28

June 14, 2005 – Introduced by Senators A. LASEE, HARSDORF, KAPANKE and COWLES, cosponsored by Representatives OTT, HAHN, FREESE, MONTGOMERY and GRONEMUS. Referred to Committee on Senate Organization.

1	Relating to: proclaiming an annual Renewable Energy Awareness Week (the week
2	of the summer solstice) and an annual Renewable Energy Awareness Day (June
3	21).
4	Whereas, nationally, the cost of energy is constantly increasing, our energy
5	needs are growing faster than our domestic sources are able to provide, demand for
6	electricity has grown more than 17 percent in the past decade, and we continue to
7	import more than one-half of our domestic oil supply; and
8	Whereas, over the past 3 years, America's energy consumption has increased
9	by roughly 4 percent, while domestic energy production has decreased by roughly 1
LO	percent; and
11	Whereas, increasingly, our energy supply is coming from other countries; and
12	Whereas, to meet our energy needs and strengthen our national security, we
13	must become less dependent on foreign oil; and
14	Whereas, our nation's present level of dependence on foreign sources of energy
15	negatively impacts the nation's trade balance; and

1	Whereas, development of renewable energy sources has a positive effect on our
2	nation's balance of trade; and
3	Whereas, the President's agenda includes an energy bill which targets four
4	important objectives, namely encouraging the use of technology to improve
5	conservation, encouraging more production at home in environmentally sensitive
6	ways, diversifying our energy supply by developing alternative sources of energy,
7	and finding better, more reliable ways to deliver energy to consumers; and
8	Whereas, in Wisconsin, sun, wind, water, and forests are plentiful and can be
9	harnessed to supply energy; and
10	Whereas, Wisconsin is recognized as a leading state for its protection of our
11	nation's precious natural resources; and
12	Whereas, in Wisconsin, 16 million acres out of 32 million acres are covered with
13	woodland; and
14	Whereas, wood and switchgrass are renewable resources and can be used for
15	fuel and energy; and
16	Whereas, harvesting wood for fuel and energy will help Wisconsin landowners
17	achieve sustainable forestry goals; and
18	Whereas, technology to convert farm waste, also in plentiful supply in
19	Wisconsin, into energy is being developed; and
20	Whereas, Wisconsin's vast farmlands can grow crops, such as soybeans, which
21	can be converted into biodiesel to fuel our nation's vehicles; and
22	Whereas, our current dependence upon petroleum cannot continue indefinitely,
23	because oil is not a limitless supply, and therefore we must develop renewable
24	sources of energy to provide an energy-secure future for generations to come; and

Whereas, ethanol, biodiesel, biomass, biogas, solar, geothermal, and
 photovoltaic are all natural renewable resources important to Wisconsin and its
 future; now, therefore, be it
 Resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring, That the legislature

alternative sources of energy; and, be it further

Resolved, That the week of the summer solstice each year be designated as
Renewable Energy Week and June 21 (the summer solstice) each year be designated
as Renewable Energy Day.
