

2005 SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 8

March 3, 2005 – Introduced by Senators KANAVAS, PLALE, LAZICH, MILLER and GROTHMAN, cosponsored by Representatives VRAKAS, VUKMIR, JESKEWITZ, KRAWCZYK, GRONEMUS, ZEPNICK, TOWNSEND, LEHMAN, HINES and VAN ROY. Referred to Committee on Senate Organization.

1	Relating to: celebrating March 25, 2005, as the 184th anniversary of Greek
2	independence.
3	Whereas, on March 25, 1821, the Greek nation began its fight for independence
4	and waged a successful War of Independence (1821-1829) and reinstituted a
5	democratic form of government; and
6	Whereas, it was Greece that first ignited the flame of freedom and is still known
7	as the "Cradle of Democracy" by, during the 6th and 5th centuries B.C. in Athens,
8	introducing to the world the idea of direct representative government, thus ushering
9	in a Golden Age of art, architecture, philosophy, and drama under such giants of
10	Western history as Pericles, Sophocles, Euripides, Socrates, and Plato; and
11	Whereas, a legacy of the Greek democratic ideal is the hope that it has always
12	inspired in oppressed people throughout the history of the world, including the
13	founding leaders of the United States of America who drew heavily on the democratic
14	principles, political experience, and philosophy of ancient Greece in forming our
15	representative form of government; and

1 Whereas, of all of the wonderful gifts bestowed upon humanity by Greece -- art, 2 ethics, beauty, literature, philosophy, and democracy -- we now celebrate the 3 greatest of these, democracy. A world without political liberty and freedom of 4 expression would be a world enshrouded in darkness, terror, and intellectual 5 sterility. Greece has shown us the light, and we are eternally grateful; now, 6 therefore, be it
