## **2005 SENATE RESOLUTION 16**

March 8, 2006 – Introduced by Senators Olsen, Jauch, Darling, Harsdorf, Erpenbach, Miller, Hansen and S. Fitzgerald. Referred to Committee on Senate Organization.

| 11 | percent of pupils scored at "basic" or "below basic" levels; and                    |
| 12 | Whereas, according to The Civic and Political Health of the Nation: A               |
| 13 | Generational Portrait, nearly one-half of 15- to 25-year-olds indicate that civic   |
| 14 | education increases their interest and participation in civic affairs; and          |

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| 1  | Whereas, individuals who have a clear understanding of the rights and  |
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| 2  | responsibilities of citizen in a representative democracy are more likely to exercise  |
| 3  | those rights and responsibilities; and   |
| 4  | Whereas, according to the Center for Information and Research on Civic   |
| 5  | Learning and Engagement, only 42 percent of eligible 18– to 24–year–olds voted in  |
| 6  | the 2004 presidential election; and  |

| 8  | been shown to engage pupils in learning, improve their attitudes toward school, and  |
| 9  | have positive effects on their civic skills, knowledge, and abilities; and   |
