

2007 ASSEMBLY BILL 383

- May 31, 2007 Introduced by Representatives VAN AKKEREN, VRUWINK, SHILLING, SHERIDAN, SINICKI, FIELDS, BENEDICT, STASKUNAS, KREUSER, A. WILLIAMS, TOWNSEND, POPE-ROBERTS, BERCEAU and SEIDEL, cosponsored by Senators HANSEN, PLALE, SULLIVAN, SCHULTZ, LASSA and ROESSLER. Referred to Committee on Workforce Development.
- 1 AN ACT relating to: increasing funding for local youth apprenticeship grants and 2 making an appropriation.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the Department of Workforce Development awards grants to local partnerships for the implementation and coordination of local youth apprenticeship programs under which employers are recruited to provide on-the-job training and supervision for students who are recruited to participate in those programs. Currently, \$1,100,000 in general purpose revenues (GPR) is appropriated in each of fiscal years 2005–06 and 2006–07 for those grants. This bill increases the amount appropriated for those grants by \$1,100,000 GPR in each of fiscal years 2007–08 and 2008–09.

amount is increased by \$1,100,000 for fiscal year 2007–08 and the dollar amount is
increased by \$1,100,000 for fiscal year 2008–09 to increase funding for the purpose
for which the appropriation is made.
