## 2007 SENATE BILL 251

August 13, 2007 – Introduced by Senators Lehman, Carpenter, Cowles, Darling, Grothman, Hansen, Lassa, Plale and Roessler, cosponsored by Representatives Ballweg, Berceau, Davis, Fields, Gottlieb, Hahn, Hebl, Hines, Hixson, Jeskewitz, Jorgensen, Kerkman, Mursau, Musser, Nass, Nelson, A. Ott, Parisi, Petrowski, Seidel, Sheridan, Sinicki, Soletski, Staskunas, Strachota, Turner, Van Roy, Vos and Zepnick. Referred to Committee on Education.

AN ACT to renumber and amend 118.164 (2); to amend 118.164 (title), 118.164
(3) (a) (intro.), 118.164 (3) (a) 4., 118.164 (3) (b), 120.13 (1) (a) (intro.), 120.13 (1)
(a) 1., 120.13 (1) (a) 2., 120.13 (1) (a) 3. and 120.13 (1) (a) 4.; and to create
118.164 (2) (a) 4. and 118.164 (2) (c) of the statutes; relating to: removal of a
pupil from class, from any portion of school property, or from a
school-sponsored activity.

#### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law generally allows a teacher to remove a pupil from his or her class if the pupil violates the code of classroom conduct adopted by the school board; is dangerous, unruly, or disruptive; or exhibits behavior that interferes with the teacher's ability to teach effectively, as specified by the code of classroom conduct.

This bill extends this ability to remove a pupil from a class to any school district employee and also allows a school district employee to remove a pupil from school property or from a school–sponsored activity supervised by that employee. Under the bill, the code of conduct must specify the kinds of behavior that interfere with the ability of a school district employee to perform his or her job effectively and that would warrant removal, from school or from a school–sponsored activity.

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# The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

3	<b>SECTION 2.</b> 118.164 (2) of the statutes is renumbered 118.164 (2) (a) (intro.) and

6	August 1, 1999, a teacher school district employee may remove a pupil from the
7	teacher's class, from any portion of school property, or from a school-sponsored
8	<u>activity that is supervised by the school district employee</u> if the pupil <del>violates</del> <u>does</u>
9	any of the following:
10	<u>1. Violates</u> the code of <del>classroom</del> conduct adopted under s. 120.13 (1) (a) or is.
11	2. Exhibits behavior that is dangerous, unruly, or disruptive or exhibits.
12	<u>3. Exhibits</u> behavior that interferes with the ability of the <u>a</u> teacher to teach

19	within 24 hours after the pupil's removal from <del>the</del> class a written explanation of the
20	reasons for the removal.

If the school district employee sends a pupil 8 to the school principal or his or her designee under this paragraph, the school district 9 employee shall immediately notify the school principal or his or her designee of the 10 reasons for the removal and shall provide to the principal or his or her designee a 11 written explanation of the reasons for the removal within 24 hours after the pupil's 12removal. 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1 118.164 (3) (b) This subsection does not prohibit the teacher school district 2 employee who removed the pupil from the class under sub. (2) or the school board, 3 school district administrator, school principal, or their designees from disciplining 4 the pupil.

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**SECTION 8.** 120.13 (1) (a) (intro.) of the statutes is amended to read:

6 120.13 (1) (a) (intro.) Make rules for the organization, gradation and 7 government of the schools of the school district, including rules pertaining to conduct 8 and dress of pupils in order to maintain good decorum and a favorable academic 9 atmosphere, which shall take effect when approved by a majority of the school board 10 and filed with the school district clerk. Subject to 20 USC 1415 (k), the school board 11 shall adopt a code to govern pupils' classroom conduct beginning in the 1999-2000 12school year. The code shall be developed in consultation with a committee of school 13district residents that consists of parents, pupils, members of the school board, school 14administrators, teachers, pupil services professionals, and other residents of the 15school district who are appointed to the committee by the school board. The code of 16 elassroom conduct may provide different standards of conduct for different schools 17and may provide additional placement options under s. 118.164 (3). The code shall include all of the following: 18
