Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, any person who is 17 years old or older may donate blood in a voluntary and noncompensatory blood program. This bill provides that a 16-year-old may donate blood in such a program if his or her parent consents to the donation.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- 4 **146.33 Blood donors.** Any person who is 17 years old or older may donate
- blood in any voluntary and noncompensatory blood program, and any person who is
- 6 16 years old may donate blood in such a program if his or her parent consents to the
