Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a person is generally required to obtain a fishing license to fish in this state. The fee for an annual resident fishing license is ordinarily \$19.25. The fee for an annual nonresident fishing license is \$49.25. Under current law the fee for an annual fishing license for a resident who is a veteran with a 70 percent or greater military-related disability is \$2.25.

Under this bill the fee for an annual fishing license for a nonresident who is a veteran with a 70 percent or greater military–related disability is \$2.25.
