### 2007 SENATE BILL 451

February 4, 2008 – Introduced by Senators JAUCH and SCHULTZ, cosponsored by Representatives POCAN, BERCEAU, BLACK, PARISI, SHERMAN, SINICKI, SMITH, TURNER and YOUNG. Referred to Committee on Environment and Natural Resources.

1	AN ACT <i>to create</i> 100.287 of the statutes; <b>relating to:</b> regulating the provision
2	of certain plastic bags to customers of retailers of consumer goods and granting
3	rule-making authority.

#### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill prohibits a person who is engaged in the retail sale of goods for personal, family, or household use from providing a plastic bag for a customer's purchases unless the bag is compostable or reusable. This prohibition takes effect three years after the bill's publication date.

## The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

4 **SECTION 1.** 100.287 of the statutes is created to read:

5 **100.287 Provision of bags by retailers.** No person who is engaged in the

6 retail sale of goods intended for personal, household, or family use may provide a

7 plastic bag to a customer for the purpose of carrying the customer's purchases unless

1 (1) A compostable plastic bag, as defined by the department by rule.

# (2) Intended for reuse, if the bag is made of plastic that is not less than 2.25 3 thousandths of an inch in thickness.
