## **2009 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 1**

January 21, 2009 – Introduced by Representatives A. Ott, BIES, BALLWEG, BLACK, KESTELL, LEMAHIEU, RIPP, ROTH, SPANBAUER, STRACHOTA, TOWNSEND, VAN ROY, M. WILLIAMS and ZIEGELBAUER, cosponsored by Senators A. LASEE, COWLES, HANSEN, LAZICH and OLSEN. Referred to Committee on Rules.

1	Relating to: proclaiming Niagara Escarpment year and month.
2	Whereas, the Niagara Escarpment is a 650 mile long geologic feature of
3	international scale and global importance that reaches across Wisconsin, Michigan,
4	Ontario, and New York; and
5	Whereas, in Wisconsin, the Niagara Escarpment extends for a distance of over
6	230 miles and runs though Door, Kewaunee, Brown, Manitowoc, Calumet, Fond du
7	Lac, Dodge, and Waukesha counties; and
8	Whereas, the Niagara Escarpment's cliff faces and high elevation on the
9	landscape provide numerous important vistas and viewsheds, several of which are
10	as much as 200 feet above the surrounding landscape; and
11	Whereas, the Niagara Escarpment corridor is home to high levels of
12	biodiversity and unique plant and animal species, and over 240 different rare,
13	threatened, or endangered plant and animal species have been identified along the
14	Niagara Escarpment; and

Whereas, the Niagara Escarpment is known to have highly sensitive 1  $\mathbf{2}$ groundwater resources due to its composition of highly fractured bedrock and karst 3 features; and

4 Whereas, the Niagara Escarpment contains numerous high-value passive recreation areas and contributes significantly to the tourism-based economy of  $\mathbf{5}$ 6 many of the corridor's communities, and two of Wisconsin's most visited State Parks 7 — Peninsula and High Cliff — lie along the Niagara Escarpment; and

8 Whereas, the Niagara Escarpment corridor has significant historical and 9 cultural features which equate with both past and present uses of its resources. The 10 Niagara Escarpment has been used since Paleo-Indian times for ceremonial 11 purposes, has a long tradition of being a top agricultural area, is home to a rapidly growing viticulture industry and wine producing region, and is known as a present 1213 day source for quality building materials such as cut stone and crushed rock; and

14Whereas, past and present landowners have used the Niagara Escarpment 15landscape as a resource for which to build communities, sustain their livelihoods, 16 and promote a strong stewardship ethic: and

17Whereas, the Niagara Escarpment has been recognized by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources as a highly ranked "Land Legacy Place"; now, 18 therefore, be it 19

**Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That** the members of the Wisconsin state legislature proclaim the year 2010 as the "Year of the Niagara 22Escarpment" in the State of Wisconsin so as to foster awareness and education on 23this important and unique landscape feature; and, be it further

 $\mathbf{24}$ **Resolved**, That the month of May 2010 be proclaimed as the "Month of the Niagara Escarpment" in the State of Wisconsin in order to promote efforts to 25

1 recognize the Niagara Escarpment's significance as a statewide geologic and natural
