

## **2009 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 48**

April 23, 2009 – Introduced by Representatives KNODL, KERKMAN, BERCEAU, POPE-ROBERTS, TOWNSEND and SPANBAUER, cosponsored by Senators Darling, TAYLOR, MILLER and LEHMAN. Referred to Committee on Rules.

| 1        | Relating to: Proclaiming May 2, 2009, as Pediatric Stroke Awareness Day.            |
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| <b>2</b> | Whereas, a stroke, also known as a "cerebrovascular accident," is an acute          |
| 3        | neurologic injury that occurs when the blood supply to a part of the brain is       |
| 4        | interrupted by a clot in the artery or a burst of the artery; and                   |
| <b>5</b> | Whereas, a stroke is a medical emergency that can cause permanent neurologic        |
| 6        | damage or even death if not promptly diagnosed and treated; and                     |
| 7        | Whereas, the risk of stroke in children is greatest in the first year of life,      |
| 8        | particularly in the first month of life when neonatal stroke occurs in about one of |
| 9        | every 4,000 live births; and  |
| 10       | Whereas, a baby can have a stroke before birth; and                                 |
| 11       | Whereas, nearly six out of every 100,000 children have a stroke each year; and      |
| 12       | Whereas, stroke is among the top ten causes of death for children in the United     |
| 13       | States; and   |
| 14       | Whereas, up to 25 percent of all children who experience a stroke die as a result;  |

| 1  | Whereas, stroke recurs in 20 percent of children who have experienced a prior          |
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| 2  | stroke; and  |
| 3  | Whereas, the death rate for children who experience a stroke before the age of         |
| 4  | one year is the highest out of all age groups; and                                     |
| 5  | Whereas, more than half of children who experience a stroke will suffer serious,       |
| 6  | long-term neurological disabilities, including hemiplegia, which is paralysis of one   |
| 7  | side of the body; seizures; speech and vision problems; and learning difficulties; and |
| 8  | Whereas, those disabilities may require lifelong physical, occupational, and           |
| 9  | speech therapies, and surgeries; and   |
| 10 | Whereas, the permanent health concerns and treatments resulting from                   |
| 11 | strokes that occur during childhood and young adulthood have a considerable impact     |
| 12 | on children, families, and society; and  |
| 13 | Whereas, very little is known about the cause, treatment, and prevention of            |
| 14 | pediatric stroke; and  |
| 15 | Whereas, medical research is the only means by which the citizens of the United        |
| 16 | States can identify and develop effective treatment and prevention strategies for      |
| 17 | childhood stroke; and  |
| 18 | Whereas, early diagnosis and treatment of pediatric stroke greatly improves            |
| 19 | the chances that the affected child will recover and not experience a recurrence; now, |
| 20 | therefore, be it   |
| 21 | Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That the legislature                  |
| 22 | designates May 2, 2009, as "Pediatric Stroke Awareness Day" and urges the people       |
| 23 | of Wisconsin to support the efforts, programs, services, and advocacy of               |

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organizations that work to enhance public and clinical awareness of prenatal,
neonatal, and childhood stroke.

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
