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2009 SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 81

April 22, 2010 - Introduced by Senators Grothman, Darling and Lazich, cosponsored by Representative Lemahieu. Referred to Committee on Small Business, Emergency Preparedness, Technical Colleges, and Consumer Protection.

Relating to: a civilian national security force.

Whereas, then senator Barack Obama stated on July 2, 2008, that "We cannot continue to rely on our military in order to achieve our national security objectives that we've set. We've got to have a civilian national security force that's just as powerful, just as strong, and just as well funded [as our military]"; and

Whereas, while it may not be unusual for a socialistic, atheistic totalitarian regime to form a huge national security force to create dependency and monitor the citizenry, our country was not founded to be such a state; and

Whereas, as any American schoolchild should know, a civilian security force as well funded as our military would be disallowed under the Ninth and Tenth Amendments; and

Whereas, while no specific national security force has yet been proposed, other Obama initiatives including a national database of school records from preschool to graduate school, a national database of medical records, federal ownership of car companies and banks, and sundry other unconstitutional expansions of federal

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power show the current chief executive has no respect for the limitations our forefathers put on our government; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring, That the Wisconsin state legislature expresses its intent to pass a law barring any federal employee of a new national security force to enforce laws which should be the purview of state and local law enforcement under our Constitution should such a national security force be established.
