### 2011 ASSEMBLY BILL 117

May 5, 2011 – Introduced by Representatives Hulsey, Pocan, Turner, Berceau, Molepske Jr, Roys, Milroy and Kessler, cosponsored by Senators Risser and S. Coggs. Referred to Committee on Tourism, Recreation and State Properties.

- 1 AN ACT to amend 20.866 (2) (z) (intro.) of the statutes; and to affect 2009
- Wisconsin Act 28, section 9106 (1) (r) 1.; **relating to:** an addition to the 2009–11
- 3 Authorized State Building Program and granting bonding authority.

#### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill amends the 2009–11 Authorized State Building Program to add additional all-agency project funding. The additional funding consists of \$200,000,000 for energy conservation. The specific projects to which the additional funding is allocated are determined by the Building Commission. The projects are financed with general fund supported borrowing.
