2017 ASSEMBLY BILL 582

- October 24, 2017 Introduced by Representatives MURPHY, HORLACHER, THIESFELDT, KOOYENGA, CONSIDINE, KREMER, E. BROOKS and SPIROS, cosponsored by Senators PETROWSKI and WIRCH. Referred to Committee on Health.
- 1 AN ACT to amend 441.16 (6), 448.21 (1) (d) and 448.21 (3); and to create 448.62 2 (2m) of the statutes; relating to: delegation of the practice of podiatry.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Generally, under current law, no person may practice podiatry unless the person is licensed as a podiatrist. This bill creates an exception to this prohibition for a physician assistant or advanced practice nurse prescriber who is providing nonsurgical patient services as directed, supervised, and inspected by a podiatrist.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **SECTION 1.** 441.16 (6) of the statutes is amended to read:
- 4 441.16 (6) Nothing in this section prohibits a nurse from issuing a prescription
- 5 order as an act delegated by a physician, and nothing in this section prohibits an
- 6 <u>advanced practice nurse certified under this section from issuing a prescription order</u>
- 7 <u>as an act delegated by a podiatrist</u>.
- 8 **SECTION 2.** 448.21 (1) (d) of the statutes is amended to read:

1	448.21 (1) (d) The practice of podiatry within the meaning of s. 448.60 (4),
2	except pursuant to a delegation by a podiatrist under s. 448.62 (2m).
3	SECTION 3. 448.21 (3) of the statutes is amended to read:
4	448.21 (3) PRESCRIPTIVE AUTHORITY. A physician assistant may issue a
5	prescription order for a drug or device in accordance with guidelines established by
6	a supervising physician and the physician assistant and with rules promulgated by
7	the board. If any conflict exists between the guidelines and the rules, the rules shall
8	control. Nothing in this subsection prohibits a physician assistant from issuing a
9	prescription order as an act delegated by a podiatrist.
10	SECTION 4. 448.62 (2m) of the statutes is created to read:
11	448.62 (2m) Any health care professional who is providing nonsurgical patient
12	services as directed, supervised, and inspected by a podiatrist who has the power to
13	direct, decide, and oversee the implementation of the patient services rendered. In
14	this subsection, "health care professional" means a physician assistant licensed
15	under subch. II of ch. 448 or an advanced practice nurse certified to issue prescription
16	orders under s. 441.16.
