2019 ASSEMBLY BILL 13

February 8, 2019 – Introduced by Representatives ROHRKASTE, GUNDRUM, KULP, MURPHY, RAMTHUN, THIESFELDT, WICHGERS, ZIMMERMAN and TUSLER, cosponsored by Senators FEYEN, DARLING, MARKLEIN and COWLES. Referred to Committee on Workforce Development.

1 AN ACT to create 20.445 (1) (bb) and 106.27 (1k) of the statutes; relating to: 2 workforce training grants for seminars in high-demand fields to teach new 3 skills and provide micro-credentials and making an appropriation.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill allows the Department of Workforce Development to award grants to nonprofit organizations and institutions of higher education in high-demand fields for the purpose of upskilling unemployed and underemployed workers in this state and providing micro-credentials to such individuals. The bill defines "upskilling" as the process of teaching new skills and a "micro-credential" as a stand-alone education product that certifies the achievement of a set of skills and knowledge required by an industry or a professional association.

13	(a) From the appropriation under s. 20.445 (1) (bb), the department shall award
14	grants to nonprofit organizations and institutions of higher education, as defined in
15	20 USC 1001 (a) and (b), to create and administer seminars in high-demand fields,
16	as determined by the department, for the purpose of upskilling unemployed and
17	underemployed workers in this state and providing micro-credentials to such
18	individuals. The total amount that a grant recipient charges individuals to attend
19	seminars and obtain credentials as described in this paragraph may not exceed 10
20	percent of the actual cost to create and administer the seminars and provide the
21	credentials.
