# 2021 ASSEMBLY BILL 1157

- March 10, 2022 Introduced by Representatives POPE, SHELTON, ANDERSON, ANDRACA, SPREITZER, VINING, SINICKI, BROSTOFF, HESSELBEIN, GOYKE, B. MEYERS, CABRERA, SNODGRASS, L. MYERS, SHANKLAND, DRAKE, EMERSON, HEBL, CONLEY, SUBECK, S. RODRIGUEZ, OHNSTAD, STUBBS, MILROY, VRUWINK and HONG, cosponsored by Senators SMITH, LARSON, JOHNSON, RINGHAND, L. TAYLOR, AGARD, CARPENTER, ROYS, ERPENBACH and BEWLEY. Referred to Committee on Rules.
- 1 AN ACT to amend 119.04 (1); and to create 20.255 (2) (e) and 118.237 of the 2 statutes; relating to: grants to school districts to pay student teachers an 3 hourly wage, granting rule-making authority, and making an appropriation.

#### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Beginning in the 2022–2023 school year, this bill requires a school board to pay each student teacher who student teaches in the school district an hourly wage of at least \$15 per hour. The bill also requires the Department of Public Instruction to reimburse school boards for the cost of paying student teachers an hourly wage of \$15 per hour. Under the bill, annually on the 3rd Monday in June, DPI must provide aid to school boards in an amount equal to \$15 times the total number of hours student teachers student taught in the school district during the preceding school term.

## **118.237 Student teachers; compensation. (1)** In this section:

- 3 (a) "Institution of higher education" means a postsecondary institution located
  4 in this state that provides an educational program for which it awards a bachelor's
  5 or higher degree and that is listed in the U.S. department of education's database of
  6 accredited postsecondary institutions and programs.
- (b) "Student teacher" means an individual enrolled in an institution of higher
  education who is participating in the student teaching component of a teacher
  preparatory program approved under s. 115.28 (7) (a).
- (2) Beginning in the 2022-2023 school year, a school board shall pay a student
  teacher who is participating in the student teaching component of a teacher
  preparatory program at a school in the school district an hourly wage of at least \$15
  for the hours the student teacher participates in the student teaching component in
  the school district.
- 15(3) Annually on the 3rd Monday of June, for each student teacher who participated in the student teaching component of a teacher preparatory program in 16 17a school district during the preceding school term, the department shall pay the school board of the school district an amount determined by multiplying \$15 times 18 19 the number of hours the student teacher participated in the student teaching 20component of the teacher preparatory program in the school district during the 21preceding school term, as reported to the department by the school board. The 22department shall make payments under this subsection from the appropriation 23under s. 20.255 (2) (e).
