Thank you for allowing the Office of Children's Mental Health (OCMH) to weigh in on policy priorities created by the Legislative Steering Committee on Supporting Healthy Early Brain Development (LSCSHEBD).

The following information outlines the OCMH's frameworks for supporting the social and emotional health of children and families. As you will see under the *Populations-Based Workforce* section, several LSCSHEBD policy proposals resonate with the mental health agenda we are forwarding in Wisconsin, e.g., trauma-informed and pyramid model consultants, parent peer specialists, and supportive and skilled child-serving workforce.

Our second highlighted framework, A Public Health Approach, provides you with our three goals:

- (1) increase resilience,
- (2) decrease toxic stress and
- (3) increase access to effective Children's Mental Health Services

Under each goal we have highlighted in red the primary policy recommendations we would recommend advancing. As you will find, we have attached a more detailed data integration proposal for our top priority, but would be pleased to create similar proposals for the other two red highlighted priorities.
