As a result of law enforcement's investigation the mother was arrested and charged with Failure to Report Death of a Child – Party to a Crime; Concealing or Not Reporting Death of a Child; Not Reporting Disappearance of a Child – Party to a Crime; Kidnapped or Missing Persons; False information (2 counts); Obstructing An Officer; Harboring A Felon; and Move/Hide/Bury Corpse of Child. The father was rrested and charged with Failure to Report Death of a Child – Party to a Crime; Concealing or Not Reporting Death of a Child; Not Reporting Disappearance of a Child – Party to a Crime; Kidnapped or Missing Persons; False Information (2 counts); Misdemeanor Bail Jumping; and Move/Hide/Bury Corpse of a Child. The following history is related to the infant's father:

On September 5, 2018, another agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the infant's now 15-year-old half-sister by that child's mother, sexual abuse to the infant's now 15-year-old half-sister by a non-caregiver, neglect to the infant's now 11-year-old half-sister by that child's mother and sexual abuse to the infant's now 11-year-old half-sister by a peer maltreater.

An assessment was completed by the agency and all allegations were unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On May 5, 2018, another agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the infant's now 9-year-old half-brother by that child's mother. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On February 8, 2017, another agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging physical abuse to the infant's now 15-year-old half-sister by that child's adult sibling. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of physical abuse was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On April 4, 2016, another agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the infant's now 17-year-old half-brother, now 15-year-old half-sister, now 9-year-old half-brother, and now 7-year-old half-sister by the mother of those children and the infant's father. On June 14, 2017, the agency screened-in a CPS Report for Alternative Response alleging neglect to the child and the child's now 6-year-old sister by the mother and her husband. An assessment was completed by the agency with the determination of services not needed. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

A Petition for Protection or Services was filed and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found insufficient evidence to substantiate neglect of the infant by the father and mother. The Medical Examiner's Office indicated the infant's cause of death to be undetermined; toxicology results are pending. The infant's 2-month-old brother, and two 1-year-old brothers were deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed with relatives. The children were subsequently returned home, and the agency implemented a Safety Plan to maintain the children safely in the home with their mother and father. Petitions for Protection or Services were filed and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
