The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect to the child by the child's father. Medical professionals determined the injuries were a result of a serious injury. The child's father was court ordered to have no contact with the child. The agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment and no service referrals were made.
