On September 23, 2018, the agency received a report regarding a 2-year-old child pronounced deceased in her home from injuries allegedly sustained on September 13, 2018. Law Enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the injuries were non-accidental in nature; toxicology results are pending. As a result of Law Enforcement's investigation, the mother was arrested and criminally charged with 1st-Degree Reckless Homicide and Neglecting a Child (Consequence is Death). A criminal charge is merely an allegation and a defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment.
